

6th Qatar-US Strategic Dialogue marks new milestones in ties

he text of the following statement was released by the Governments of the State of Qatar and the US of America on the occasion of the 6th Qatar-US Strategic Dialogue.

The joint statement reads as follows: HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani and Secretary of State of the US of America Antony Blinken led the 6th Qatar-US Strategic Dialogue on March 5, 2024, in Washington, DC.

The topics at this year's Dialogue highlighted the breadth and depth of the 50-year Qatar-US relationship, from economic and security co-operation to emerging technology and fostering connections among cities and communities between both countries.

ing an amendment to the bilateral Defence Co-operation Agreement, a Memorandum of Co-operation on biometric datasharing to enhance law enforcement and counterterrorism cooperation, and a Memorandum of Understanding to open the first "American Corner" in Qatar since 2014.

A special session dedicated to the FIFA Men's World Cup centred on event organisation, legacy, and security at the 2022 tournament in Doha - marking the passing of the baton from Qatar to North America ahead of the 2026 World Cup.

Global Co-operation

Qatar and US officials discussed key priorities, including Venezuela, Gaza, Afghanistan, global humanitarian assistance and development, the Horn of Africa, Yemen, and Ukraine.

Secretary Blinken expressed his deep appreciation for Qatar's continued leadership in the region, including important mediation efforts to facilitate humanitarian assistance to civilians in Gaza and secure the release of hostages, including US citizens, held by Hamas.


US and Qatari officials also discussed challenges in Afghanistan

and the extraordinary teamwork between the two countries on the relocation to the US, through Qatar, of thousands of eligible individuals from Afghanistan.

A new US-Qatar Agreement in Temporary Hosting of Individuals at Risk Due to the Situation in Afghanistan, announced during the Dialogue, is already enhancing America's ability to process Afghanistan relocations through Oatar. The US expressed gratitude for Qatar's continued support on the protection of US interests in Afghanistan.

Qatar and the US shared concerns about instability in the Horn of Africa and the worsening humanitarian situation and continued fighting in Sudan. Both sides underscored their commitment to promoting a negotiated politiflict, while condemning unlawcommercial shipping in the Red Sea. On Lebanon, the two sides underscored the need to press Lebanon's leaders to end the presidential impasse and implement economic reforms. To Page 12

Noted Kuwaiti entrepreneur and author Mohamed al-Sharekh passes away

Renowned Kuwaiti entrepreneur and author Mohamed al-Sharekh passed away yesterday. He was 82. Al-Sharekh, a multi-talented personality, had made various key achievements throughout his career, in particular in technology and computer software. He excelled in more than one area, showcasing a diverse range of abilities. He was a visionary whose innovative ideas and dedication inspired many.

Al-Sharekh was the founder and chairman of the board of directors of Sakhr Software Company (established 1982), which was the first to introduce the Arabic language Operating System into computers. It was accompanied by a suite of translation programmes. including the Holy Our

and the "Arab Organisation for Translation." He was also one of the contributors to the establishment of the "Arab World Institute" in Paris.

In 2016 project "Al-Sharekh Archive" for Arabic literary and cultural magazines, making them available on the Internet. Al-Sharekh served as a Deputy Director General for the Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development from 1969 to 1973, and as representative of Kuwait and Arab Group of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (I.B.R.D), Washington, DC from 1973 to 1975 and cofounded and chaired the Board of Directors of the Industrial Bank of Kuwait, among other key positions. In 1968, Al-Sharekh published his first story titled Qais and Layla. He also has three published collections of short stories, and a novel titled The Family, published in 2018, among other works.

Donald Trump and President Joe Biden finally kicked off their bitter White House rematch vesterday as the Republican's final rival Nikki Haley threw in the towel after a crushing defeat in the "Super Tuesday" primaries. Within seconds of Haley's withdrawal Biden, 81, and former president Trump, 77, began competing for her moderate supporters in a contest between two elderly men that many American voters say they don't want.

Declining to endorse Trump, who faces multiple criminal indictments and a scandal over his attempt to overthrow the 2020 election, Haley said he would have to earn the support of her followers. "I congratulate him and wish him well," Haley, 52, said of Trump in her home state of South Carolina, adding however that the United States "must turn away from the darkness of hatred and division. Haley's withdrawal clears the stage for a one-of-a-kind election on November 5 where the stakes for a turbulent global order could not be higher - but whose key players have failed to enthuse many Americans.

Biden swept his Democratic "Super Tuesday" primaries but must now gear up for Thursday's State of the Union address, a defining moment as the unpopular 81-year-old seeks to allay voter concerns over his age, the economy and the war in Gaza. Trump proclaimed that he had "TROUNCED" Haley, and invited her supporters to "join the greatest movement in the history of our nation." Biden hailed her courage for telling the "truth about Trump" and said there was a place for her voters in his campaign. "You don't have to agree with me on everything to know MAGA extremism is a threat to this country," Biden said on X. Page 11

alks on a ceasefire and hostage exchange between Israel and the Palestinian resistance movement Hamas were deadlocked yesterday, as the humanitarian crisis in Gaza prompted growing Western concern and a Houthi attack on a ship in the Gulf of Aden killed at least two people.

Negotiators from the Palestinian group, Qatar and Egypt - but not Israel - are trying to secure a 40-day ceasefire in time for the Muslim fasting month of Ramadan, which begins early next week.

The United States is worried that the Gaza conflict could spread in the Middle East, especially after a series of attacks on vessels in the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden by Iran-aligned Houthi forces acting in solidarity with the Palestinians.

In the latest attack, at least two sailors were killed in a Houthi attack on a freighter, the first deaths reported since the Yemeni group began the strikes against shipping in one of the world's busiest sea lanes.

Health officials in Gaza said the number of people confirmed killed in Israel's offensive had now passed 30.700.

Hamas pledged to continue to take part in the Cairo talks, but officials in the group said a ceasefire must be in place before hostages are freed, Israeli forces must leave Gaza and all Gazans must be able to return to homes they have fled.

was a motivation to exert further efforts to cover other aspects that concern exhibitors. He said that they will be announced once the international agenda of similar exhibitions is carefully reviewed to avoid overlapping, affirming that the coming events will be diverse and include other branches to ensure maintaining the identity of Dimdex as an event exclusively related to maritime security.


Several companies signed contracts for their participation in the 2026 edition to ensure that they had reserved their designated spaces, after all spaces in the 2024 edition were reserved a month before

its launch, prompting an exponential number of participating firms this year to reserve their spaces and pavilions, al-Ansari confirmed.

He pointed out that there is an intention to increase the number of firms by considering the available spaces and the centre's capacity, adding that the organising committee was committed to increasing the number of exhibitors to figure out the negative points or feedback to be avoided in the future, but all companies underscored the high organisational skills, he underlined.

The Chairman of the Organising Committee stressed that the event is one of the most professional exhibitions in the world, in terms of the organisational level and services afforded to exhibitors, pointing out that the organising committee had launched an electronic application on cell phones that included details that broadly benefited the visitors. delegations and firms through which appointment requests could be handled between company officials, visitors and delegations.

Cabinet okays new draft law for persons with special needs

E the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State for Defence Affairs Dr Khalid bin Mohamed al-Attiyah chaired the Cabinet's weekly meeting held at the Amiri Diwan on Wednesday.

After the meeting, HE the Minister of Justice and Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Ibrahim bin Ali al-Mohannadi issued the following statement: The Cabinet considered the topics on its agenda as follows: First, the Cabinet approved a draft law on people with disabilities, and decided to refer it to the Shura Council.

The draft law is prepared to replace Law No 2 of 2004 on people with special needs.

Objectives of the draft law include ensuring full and effective participation of persons with disabilities in the society, enabling them to exercise all human rights and fundamental freedoms on an equal basis with others, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of or because of disability, achieving equal opportunities between persons with disabilities and others, ensuring their inclusion in the society and in various areas of life,

The draft law is prepared to replace Law No 2 of 2004 for people with disabilities

ensuring the promotion of dignity and autonomy of persons with disabilities; and ensuring and respecting the rights of children with disabilities, preserving their identity, developing their capabilities and skills, and enhancing their integration and participation in society.

Second, the Cabinet approved the Makkah Al-Mukarramah Convention of Member States of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation on Anti-Corruption Law Enforcement Co-operation.

Third, the Cabinet approved: 1-Draft agreement for co-operation in the field of emergency situations between the governments of Qatar and Armenia.

2- Draft memorandum of understanding (MoU) on co-operation in the field of veterinary quarantine, and the import and export of live animals and birds free of epidemic and infectious diseases between the Ministry of Municipality of the State of Qatar and the National Sanitary Veterinary and Food Safety Authority in Romania. Fourth, the Cabinet reviewed

the following topics and took appropriate decisions thereon: 1- Annual report on the results of the work of the Permanent Population Committee for 2023.

2- Report (57) on the results of the work of the National Committee for the Prohibition of Weapons during the period from 1/9 to 31/12/2023.

3- Report on the results of the participation Qatar's delegation, headed by HE the Minister of Commerce and Industry, in the activities of the Qatar-Kazakhstan Business Roundtable.

4- Report on the results of the participation of Qatar's delegation, headed by HE the Minister of Municipality, in the Global Forum for Food and Agriculture, and the 16th Conference of Agriculture Ministers. (QNA)

PHCC Wellness Centre launches Ramadan health awareness drive

he Wellness Centre at Rawdat Al Khail Health Centre has conducted an awareness event for gym instructors and health coaches to provide guidance on identifying possible ways of continuing their usual exercise programme, healthy eating, sleep, and self-care during Ramadan.

Dr Sarah Rashid Musa, wellness in-charge at Rawdat Al Khail Health Centre and consultant community medicine, stated: "Fasting can have effect on different variables including nutrition, hydration, and sleep patterns. It also reduces alertness, motivation, physical and psychomotor performance, therefore it is important to plan a holistic approach to meet the need for each individual including biological, psychological, cognitive and behavioural and not be "one -size-fits-it".

Patients were made aware of the importance of maintaining their physical activity during Ramadan to enhance their weight control, physical and muscular fitness, mental health, help to control medical conditions and increase energy level. Gym instructors explained the precautions to be taken while practicing physical activities during the month of Ramadan.

"One of the biggest challenges of fasting is staying hydrated," Dr Sarah added. "It is essential to drink plenty of water before sunrise and keep your body hydrated, avoid sugary drinks like sodas and energy drinks. Getting enough sleep is also essential to help the body recharge and recover aiming for 7-8 hours of sleep per night and try to go to bed early to maintain the sleep cycle.

"To help improve quality of sleep, avoid caffeine and other stimulants before bedtime. Also to consider naps and schedule times to rest to avoid fatigue."

HIBA, HMC honour 93 organ donors, families

he Qatar Organ Donation Center (HIBA) and Hamad Medical Corp (HMC) honoured 93 organ donors and their families, in the presence of HE the Minister of Public Health (MoPH) Dr

During the ceremony, which marked another successful year for Qatar's Organ Transplant and Organ Donation Programmes, 52 living kidney donors, 2 liver donors, and 17 bone marrow donors were honoured. The event also honoured the families of 22 deceased donors whose selfless donations were able to support 42 transplant operations, including 30 kidneys, nine liver and three lung transplants, HMC said in a statement yesterday.

At the event, the Medal of Altruism was presented to living donors and the families of deceased donors. The event also saw acknowledgement of Qatari kidney transplant recipients who chose to have their transplant surgery in Qatar rather than going abroad for treatment. To mark this occasion. HMC's Chief Medical Officer Dr Abdalla al-Ansari said the organisation has worked tirelessly with the Qatar Center for Organ Transplantation to implement the tenets of the Doha Donation Accord, pointing out that the people of Qatar, both citizens and residents, continue to show their support for Qatar's unique, world-class, and equitable organ donation and transplant programmes.

Al-Ansari thanked them for their unwavering support, adding that he was proud of this tremendous accomplishment. He thanked all colleagues at HMC and cadres in all transplant and organ donation programmes for their tireless efforts and dedication to their ongoing work. For his part, Director, Qatar Organ Donation Center, and member of the World Health Organisation Expert Group Dr Riadh Fadhil said the nation's organ donor registry surpassed 530,000

registered donors, representing around 25% of Qatar's adult population.

There are more than 131 nationalities represented in the registry that reflected positively on the rate of organ donation among all nationalities, which is a unique achievement especially considering the registry was only established 10 years ago," added Dr Fadhil.

He added that respect for human rights, autonomy and equity made Qatar a model of ethical and best clinical practice that is much-admired by the international transplant community. Deputy Chief Medical Officer for Clinical Affairs and Director of Qatar Center for Organ Transplantation Dr Yousuf al-Maslamani emphasised that Qatar's organ transplant programme offers kidney, liver and lung transplant surgeries making HMC one of the most comprehensive transplant centres in the region.

"Since the start of our transplant programme in 1986, we have worked hard and strengthened the exceptional care we provide to our patients. We have in place a multidisciplinary team with some leading international experts that enabled us to deliver the highest levels of care to our patients who need these procedures" said Dr al-Maslamani.

An organ transplant can be a life-saving procedure. It can also significantly improve the quality of life for someone with chronic organ failure. A deceased organ donor can save up to eight lives. It is also possible to donate a kidney or part of the liver while alive. (QNA)

MoPH launches 5 e-services for food safety system "Watheq"

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) announced that it has added five new electronic services in addition to the available services in the electronic food safety system, 'Watheq', bringing the number of services provided within the system to 19. New services include Inspection service of food consignment for export. Inspection service of food consignment for re-export, Request for Food Export Certificate, Request for a Food Re-export Certificate, and Request for Certificate verification, MoPH reported yesterday.

Director of the Food Safety Department at MoPH, Wassan Abdullah al-Baker, said: "The new e-services that have been launched are part of the continuous efforts aimed to developing the electronic food safety system, implementing automation plans for all services related to food safety and linking them electronically to facilitate the procedures for

all stakeholders such as importers, suppliers, and regulatory authorities.'

The new services that have been launched contribute to facilitating and accelerating the procedures for inspecting food consignments at ports and electronic. verification of health certificates for exported or reexported food, al-Baker added.

It is noteworthy that 6,253 food establishments were registered, 57,288 food products were approved, and 55,782 electronic transactions were done in the system since its launch in September 2022. The number of shipments inspected since the launch of the system reached 305,857 food consignments, as well as 5,926 local food establishments, in addition to the withdrawal of 19,251 samples at the ports and 37,851 samples during local inspection that were examined in food laboratories. (QNA)

Kahramaa, Chubu renew agreement in renewable energy sector


WCM-Q pre-med students present research posters

First-year pre-medical students of Weill Cornell Medicine-Qatar (WCM-Q) rounded off the work of two semesters by presenting their findings at an open poster session, a statement said yesterday.

A total of 56 students, working in groups of two and three, executed independent research projects from beginning to end, from carrying out a literature review and formulating a question and a hypothesis, to conducting experiments in the laboratory, gathering and analysing the data, writing up the results and finally presenting their findings to fellow students and WCM-Q faculty.

The projects investigated the antimicrobial effects of a variety of herbs, spices and other natural products traditionally used to prevent or treat infections.

To do this, the students cultivated several different species of bacteria in nutrient agar in petri dishes and introduced the natural remedy, observing how far each was able to inhibit the bacteria's growth. The students presented a total of 19 posters investigating the an-ti-microbial effects of the following natural remedies: Nigella sativa oil, lemon juice, thyme oil, olive oil, cajuput oil, fennel oil, neem oil, the traditional Sudanese fermented drink abreh, cardamom,

cinnamon, turmeric, ivy extract, saffron, clove oil, shilajit, sumac, wax apple peel extract, onion, rose extract, Japanese matcha, black tea, and propolis oil, a resin-like material made by bees from the buds of cone-bearing trees.

The students worked on their projects in biology classes over the course of 16 weeks during the fall and spring semesters.

Dr Kuei-Chiu Chen, professor of biology, said: "This course presents the first opportunity for students on the Six-Year Medical Programme to come up with a research question and then design an experiment to test their hypothesis. They showed a very good understanding of the process and brought many new and unique ideas to their projects, and they did a great job of interpreting their data, presenting their work, and speaking confidently about their findings. The beauty of this course is that it gives the students a keen understanding of how a research project is conducted from beginning to end, which is a key part of their development as physicianscientists."

Students Mohamed Abdullah Chattha, Mustafa Ahmad Ghuman and Abdulla Fakhroo presented a poster about their research investigating the anti-hacterial properties of oil extracts of neem trees and fennel seeds, both of which are commonly used in traditional medicine approaches. Chattha said: "Through our experiments we found out that the antimicrobial effect of neem oil and fennel oil are far stronger when they are used in combination than when they are used separately."



Strong US economy sends dollar bears into hibernation

A stronger-than-expected US economy is buoying the dollar, frustrating investors who had bet the currency would wilt under a barrage of interest rate cuts that have yet to materialise.

The dollar index, which measures the buck against a basket of its peers, is up 2.4% year-to-date. Net bets on the dollar in futures markets swung positive last month for the first time since late November, Commodity Futures Trading Commission data showed.

Driving the US currency's stubborn strength is a robust US economy that has made the Fed hesitant to ease monetary policy too quickly and risk an inflationary rebound.

US gross domestic product grew at a 3.2% annualised rate in the fourth quarter. By contrast, the eurozone's economy stagnated last year, China faces a deepening property crisis, and Japan unexpectedly slipped into recession at the end of 2023.

While the US economy has remained resilient, "there is no significant evidence Europe and China are picking up," said Thierry Wizman, global FX and rates strategist at Macquarie, who has become more neutral on the dollar after his bearish outlook last year. "That's the reason people have had this change of heart" on the dollar, he said.

The dollar's strength was be tested this week as investors braced for Fed Chairman Jerome Powell to testify before lawmakers on Wednesday and today and await US employment data at the end of the week. Signs that the Fed is sticking with its "higher for longer" messaging on rate cuts or that the US economy continues to stay strong could support the dollar's rally.

Investors are pricing in some 85 basis points of rate cuts for 2024, compared to more than 150 basis points they had factored in early January, futures tied to the Fed's policy rate showed.

Among the dollar bulls is Ugo Lancioni, head of currency at Neuberger Berman, who is betting on the greenback to continue rising thanks to US outperformance even though he believes it has traders is high grown expensive relative to other currencies. "Our call right now is purely a relative growth type of call," he said. Getting the dollar's trajectory right is important for investors, given the currency's central role in global finance. A strong dollar could weigh on the outlook for US multinationals as it makes it more expensive to convert their foreign profits into dollars, while also making exporters' products less competitive abroad. About a quarter of S&P 500 companies generate more than 50% of revenues outside the US, FactSet data showed. Dollar strength could also complicate other central banks' efforts to fight inflation as it makes their currencies cheaper. The European Central Bank, which concludes its monetary policy meeting on Thursday, has also pushed back against rate cut talk due to sticky inflation. Signs that the euro zone's policymakers might further delay easing could boost the euro at the dollar's expense. Strategists are still broadly bearish on the dollar, though the dollar's persistent strength is testing their outlook. While the median forecast among currency strategists is for the dollar to weaken over the rest of the year, some 80% believed there was a risk of the dollar exceeding their target, a Reuters poll showed in February.



MWC24 and future prospects

he Mobile World Congress and Barcelona have virtually become synonymous and the festive air at the 2024 edition was no different. Sunshine and clouds played hide and seek outside the world's largest and most influential connectivity event, but inside we were all warming up to the breathtaking technology and innovations taking place across the world – on display on a single stage

In all, four days of vibrant discussion and networking saw industry leaders and attendees from across the mobile ecosystem making the most of the opportunity.

Mobile Economy Report 2024

To mark the opening of MWC Barcelona, the GSMA launched its annual Mobile Economy Report, spotlighting the latest trends shaping the global mobil ecosystem with recommended areas of investment to help the industry expand mobile access and improve service quality. The key findings include: • By 2029, 5G is projected to represent over half (51%) of all mobile connections, with its adoption rate increasing to 56% by the decade's end. • At the close of 2023, 58% of the global population, or 4.7bn individuals, were accessing the Internet via mobile devices. marking a rise of 2.1bn users since 2015. Despite having access to mobile broadband networks, 3bn people do not use mobile internet. highlighting the critical 'Usage Gap? This emphasises the need to tackle adoption barriers, such as the cost of mobile devices and the lack of literacy/digital skills, as pointed out by the GSMA's 'Breaking Barriers' initiative. • In 2023, mobile technologies and services contributed to 5.4% of the worldwide GDP, translating to an economic value of \$5.7tn. • The global economy is poised to gain over \$930bn from 5G by 2030, with the manufacturing sector (36%), public administration (15%), and services industry (10%) standing to benefit the most.

Intelligence, the enterprise segment currently boasts 10.7bn IoT connections, surpassing the consumer segment's 10.5bn. This trend is anticipated to surge, with enterprise connections expected to more than double to 38.5bn by 2030. Smart buildings and smart manufacturing are projected to constitute 34% and 16% of these enterprise connections, respectively. • The introduction of 5G-Advanced, following the 3GPP Release 18, marks another pivotal milestone in IoT development. This advancement is set to trigger new 5G investments from 2024 into 2025. Reports indicate that over half of the operators plan to start deploying 5G-Advanced solutions within a year of their availability, focusing on essential use cases like 5G multicast services and affordable IoT support. \bullet There are also forecasts for a fourfold increase in mobile data traffic from now until 2030, highlighting the crucial role of expanding 5G coverage and capacity and underscoring the necessity for ongoing investments in infrastructure. Expectedly, the average monthly global mobile data traffic per connection will rise from 12.8GB in 2023 to 47.9GB by 2030. • The surge in Generative AI (GenAI) utilisation currently being tested by 56% of operators - will likely contribute significantly to this data traffic increase. This growth will be fuelled by various applications, such as the deployment of GenAI-

powered chatbots for customer service and the expanding production of AI-generated video and music content.

GSMA Open Gateway: Unlocking 5G potential tem for N

hackathon at MWC Barcelona 2024, a newly introduced zone focusing on digital expertise. Over the course of two days, 48 tech experts took on the challenge to innovate and shape the future of telecommunications through their projects The Talent Arena, with its primary goal of fostering connections between digital professionals of varied disciplines and leading Barcelona-based companies, served as a hub for discovering emerging trends and career possibilities within the digital domain.

Paul Mielczarski, head of macro strategy at Brandywine Global, sees the dollar's recent rebound as more of a "tactical rally as opposed to a change in the underlying trend overall."

Mielczarski is encouraged by nascent signs of improving growth outside the US, including strength in the global semiconductor cycle, which benefits currencies like the Korean won.

Others, however, see more reasons for dollar strength especially if former US president Donald Trump gains the upper hand in a presidential reelection race that has been deadlocked for months.

Analysts at Capital Economics wrote that Trump's proposed tariff increases could shift the Fed back to a tightening bias on monetary policy and set off a wider trade war that spurs safe haven demand for the US currency. The dollar initially rallied after Trump won the 2016 election but fell 10.5% during his term.

While that may be far off, investors will still likely be hesitant to renew bearish bets against the greenback, Macquarie's Wizman said. "I think it's a 'show me' story," he said. "The amount of scepticism

Commercial 5G services: the future

• By January 2024, 261 operators across 101 nations had initiated commercial 5G services, with over 90 operators from 64 markets pledging to future rollouts. Among these services, 47 operate on 5G Standalone (SA) networks, and there are 89 upcoming deployments that will leverage advancements such as network slicing, ultra-reliable low-latency communications, and the streamlined architecture of 5G SA networks.

Haley quits, paving way for Trump-Biden rematch

rikki Haley ended her longshot challenge to Republican presidential frontrunner Donald Trump yesterday, ensuring the former president will be the party's candidate in a rematch with Democratic President Joe Biden in November's election.

Haley, the former South Carolina governor and Trump's ambassador to the United Nations, bowed out a day after Super Tuesday, when Trump beat her soundly in 14 of 15 Republican nominating contests.

"The time has now come to suspend my campaign," Haley told supporters during a speech in Charleston. "I have no regrets."

She said it was likely Trump who repeatedly belittled her candidacy – would be the Republican nominee but did not endorse him.

"It is now up to Donald Trump to earn the votes of those in our party and beyond it who did not support him," she said. "And I hope he does that."

Drawing on her foreign policy experience at the UN, Haley said it was important to continue US global leadership. Throughout her campaign, Haley said the United

States must help Ukraine defend itself against Russian aggression, a position at odds with Trump. "If we retreat further, there will

be more war, not less," she said. Trump did capture the endorsement yesterday of Mitch McConnell, the longtime Senate Republican leader who some party hardliners considered insufficiently allied with the former

president. "It should come as no surprise that as nominee, he will have my support," said McConnell, who is stepping down as leader.

There was no indication Trump would moderate his message. Just as Haley was conceding the

race, he criticised her before inviting her supporters to join him. "Nikki Haley got TROUNCED last night, in record setting fashion," Trump wrote on the Truth Social media platform.

In contrast, Biden praised Haley for daring to "speak the truth" about Trump and extended his own invitation to her supporters.

"Donald Trump made it clear he doesn't want Nikki Haley's supporters. I want to be clear: There is a place for them in my campaign," Biden said in a statement.

Haley lasted longer than any other Republican challenger to Trump but never posed a serious

threat to the former president, whose iron grip on the party's base remains firm despite multiple criminal indictments.

The rematch between Trump, 77, and Biden, 81 – the first repeat US presidential contest since 1956 - is one that few Americans want. Opinion polls show both Biden and Trump have low approval ratings among voters.

The election promises to be deeply divisive in a country already riven by political polarisation. Biden has cast Trump as an existential danger to demoable in the November 5 election against Biden. As in 2020, the race is likely to come down to a handful of swing

politics could make him vulner-

states, thanks to the winner-takeall, state-by-state Electoral College system that determines the presidential election. Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin are all expected to be closely contested in November.

The central issues of the campaign have already come into focus. Despite low unemployment. a red-hot stock market and easing inflation, voters experiencing post-pandemic inflation have voiced dissatisfaction with Biden on the economy.

Biden's other major weakness is the state of the US-Mexico border, where a surge of migrants overwhelmed the system after Biden eased some Trump-era policies. Trump's hawkish stance on immigration - including a promise to initiate the largest deportation effort in history - is at the core of his campaign, just as it was in 2016.

Voters expect Trump would do a better job on both the economy and immigration, according to opinion polls.

Trump may be dogged by criminal charges throughout the year. The federal case charging him with trying to overturn the 2020 election, perhaps the weightiest he faces, has been paused while Trump pursues a long-shot argument that he is immune from prosecution.

Biden has said Trump poses a threat to democracy, citing the January 6, 2021, attack on the US Capitol by a mob of Trump supporters seeking to reverse Biden's 2020 victory.

Haley had been among the first Republican contenders to enter the race in February 2023, but she only garnered attention after her standout debate performances later in the year.

Through it all, she was reluctant to completely disavow her former boss. Trump showed no such reticence, frequently insulting her intelligence and Indian heritage.

Only in the last months of her campaign did Haley begin to forcefully hit back at Trump, questioning his mental acuity, calling him a liar and saying he was too afraid to debate her.

Still, she said that as president she would pardon Trump if he were convicted in any of the criminal cases he faces, a position she never abandoned.

Man vaccinated for Covid 217 times reports no side effects: scientists

A German man who deliberately got vaccinated for Covid-19 a whopping 217 times did not report any side effects from his many jabs, according to researchers studying possibly the "most vaccinated person in history".

The immune system of the 62-year-old man from the central German city of Magdeburg who has not been named - is still firing on all cylinders, the researchers said in The Lancet Infectious Diseases journal. They said the man voluntarily received so many shots against all medical advice, and warned against jumping to far-reaching conclusions from this single case.

The man first came to the attention of the German-led researchers due to news reports in 2022, when he had only received 90 jabs. Media reports at the time said the man was suspected of getting so many doses to collect the completed vaccination cards, which could then be forged and sold to people who did not want to be vaccinated. A public prosecutor in Magdeburg opened an investigation into allegations of fraud over the case but no criminal charges were filed, according to the scientific paper published earlier this week. The prosecutor collected

evidence of 130 vaccinations over nine months, it added. But the man claims to have received 217 vaccine doses of eight different Covid vaccines including all mRNA versions – over 29 months. Kilian Schober, a virologist

at Germany's University of Erlangen-Nuremberg and study co-author, said in a statement that when they contacted the man, he was "very interested" in undergoing a range of tests to examine the effect of so many vaccinations. The case allowed the

researchers an extremely rare chance to study what is known as "hyper-vaccination". Some scientists have theorised that after being hit by so many vaccinations, a body's immune cells would become less effective as they became accustomed to the antigens. But that was not the case for the German man, the researchers

found. In fact, he had "considerably higher concentrations" of immune cells and antibodies for the Covid virus than a control aroup of three people who received the recommended three vaccinations, the study said. His body also showed no sign of fatigue from all those vaccinations - his 217th jab still boosted his number of

antibodies against Covid, the researchers found.

The man reported that he never had any vaccine-related side effects from any of the 217 jabs. He also never tested positive for Covid and showed no signs of past infection, the researchers said

But they warned against taking away any wider lessons from the man's experience. "It should go without saying that we do not endorse hypervaccination," Schober wrote on X.

Caitjan Gainty, an expert in the history of vaccines at King's College London not involved in the study, told AFP she had "never come across a historical discussion of someone who received more vaccinations than this"

It is "relatively unlikely" that anyone has ever had more vaccinations than the man, she added.

Spyros Lytras, a virologist at the University of Tokyo, said it wa a "comically large number of vaccinations" "Whether this is the most vaccinated person in history, I cannot know, but they are certainly the most vaccinated person reported to date" by some margin, he told AFP. "And I doubt that we're going to see another such report any time soon."

India yesterday opened a new naval base on its Indian Ocean island close to the Maldives, as ties with Male remain tense and New Delhi jostles anew with China for influence in the region. INS Jatayu, the new base on Minicoy Island, on India's Lakshadweep archipelago, had been under construction for years, and is India's most distant base on its western coast. The navy has had a small presence on the island for decades. The opening comes just as the Maldives pushes India to start withdrawing

its nearly 80 troops who have been stationed there to provide technical and medical assistance on three aircraft given to its southern neighbour nation by India earlier.

The Maldives, which have traditionally had close ties to India, is pivoting towards Beijing since new President Mohamed Muizzu was elected in October on a promise to end the country's pro-India stance. India's new base on Minicoy is around 78 miles from the Maldives

Bhutto, the founder of the Pakistan People's Party (PPP) now run by his grandson and former foreign minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, was hanged in 1979 after a trial under the military regime of late General Zia-ul-Hao

'We didn't find that the fair trial and due process requirements were met," said Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa in remarks telecast live of the ruling that he said was a unanimous decision by a nine-member bench headed by him.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif

miscarriage of justice under Zia's martial law regime," said Yousuf Nazar, London-based political commentator and a close aide of the late Benazir Bhutto, Zulfikar Ali Bhutto's daughter and also a former prime minister. She was assassinated in 2007.

Rights groups say Haq's 11 years of dictatorship were marked by an assault on democracy, persecution and jailing of PPP workers and public flogging of opponents and critics. 2023 was deadliest year for migrants in a decade: UN

t least 8,565 people died on migration routes worldwide in 2023, making it the deadliest year since records began a decade ago, the United Nations said vesterday.

"The 2023 death toll represents a tragic increase of 20% compared to 2022, highlighting the urgent need for action to prevent further loss of life," the UN's International Organisation for Migration said in a statement.

The IOM said last year's total surpassed the previous record reached in 2016, when 8.084 people died during migration. So far this year, 512 deaths have already been recorded.

The IOM said that because safe and regular migration pathways remain limited, hundreds of thousands of people attempt to migrate every year via irregular routes in unsafe conditions.

The Mediterranean Sea, where many migrants try to reach southern Europe from northern Africa, continues to be the deadliest route for migrants, with at least 3,129 deaths and disappearances registered last year.

It is the highest number of deaths on the Mediterranean migration routes since 2017.

In one incident alone an overcrowded trawler, the Adriana, sank off the coast of Greece in on June 14 last year, with the loss of more than 600 lives.

Unprecedented numbers of migrant deaths were recorded last vear across Africa (1.866) and Asia (2.138). In Africa, most of the deaths occurred in the Sahara Desert and the sea route to Spain's Canary Islands. In Asia, hundreds of deaths of Afghan and Rohingya refugees were recorded last year.

Slightly more than half of the total migrant deaths in 2023 came as a result of drowning, with 9% caused by vehicle accidents, and 7% in violence. "As we mark the Missing Migrants Project's 10 years, we first remember all these lives lost," said

IOM deputy director general Ugochi Daniels. "Every single one of them is a

terrible human tragedy that reverberates through families and communities for years to come?

The IOM's Missing Migrants Project was established in 2014 as an open-access database on migrant deaths and disappearances. It has since documented 63,872 cases worldwide.

However, the true figure is estimated to be much higher due to challenges in data collection, particularly in remote locations such as the Darien Gap jungle in Panama, and on maritime routes, where boats disappear without trace.

Russia hits Ukraine port as Zelensky, Greek PM visit

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky and Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis were visiting the Black Sea port of Odesa yesterday when a Russian missile hit the infrastructure, close enough for leaders to see the strike. "It seems to me that we have not only heard, we have seen this strike today," Zelensky told a joint press conference.

The attack occurred at an estimated 500 to 800 metre distance from the delegations, sources said.

"You see who we're dealing with, they don't care where to hit."

The Ukrainian air force announced a ballistic missile threat in the region this morning but there were no official reports up until the press conference after leaders inspected the port and Ukraine's humanitarian corridor for maritime exports

The strike killed five people, a Ukrainian navy spokesperson said. Mitsotakis, who was on his first visit to the country since Russia's invasion in February 2022, said that during the tour the delegation heard sirens and a big explosion as they headed towards their cars.

"I believe that this is for us the most vivid reminder that there is a real war waging here," Mitsotakis said, urging other European leaders to visit Ukraine to get a first-hand sense of the war's impact on civilians.

The Russian Defence Ministry said its troops attacked a hangar housing Ukrainian naval drones in the port, adding that "the goal has been achieved". Ukraine's Black Sea port infrastructure has been a constant target for Russian attacks, which have stepped up since mid-July when Moscow quit a UNbrokered deal that allowed safe passage of Ukrainian grain shipments and Kyiv established its own export corridor.

Russia has launched over 880 attack drones and over 170 missiles on Odesa region port infrastructure since, a Ukrainian navy commander said during the tour.

"No-one is intimidated by this new attempt at terror – certainly not the two leaders on the ground nor the brave people of Ukraine," European Commission President Ursula von der Leven said on X. commenting on the attack. Greece, a Nato member and a traditional ally to Ukraine's bid to join the military alliance and the European Union, has offered military help to the country

On Ukraine, the US expressed deep appreciation for Qatar's pledge of \$100mn in humanitarian aid. as well as Oatar's recent success in brokering a deal to reunite with their families 11 Ukrainian children - the third and largest group of children reunited, thanks to Oatari diplomacy.

Trade and Investment

Qatar and the US highlighted the strong economic and commercial relations between the two countries and discussed trade and two-way investment, as well as advancing co-operation in the fields of innovation, critical minerals, technology, secure information communications technology, and clean energy.

Counterterrorism. Security

Qatar and the US highlighted their strong bilateral security partnership, expressing a desire to build greater collaboration and capacity in aviation and border security, information sharing, countering violent extremism and combating terrorism and the financing of terrorism. The US expressed its appreciation for robust ongoing counterterrorism co-ordination between the two countries

Defence Co-operation

The two governments further strengthened their co-operation and close security partnership under the existing Qatar-US **Defence Co-operation Agreement** and reaffirmed their commitment to promote peace and stability, counterterrorism, and grow the enduring Qatar-US defence partnership. The two governments noted the importance of advancing co-operation to strengthen labour protection, including access to justice, as outlined in the November 2022 Letter of Intent signed by Secretary Blinken and Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani. They expressed a shared desire to deepen protections for trafficking victims through screening and victim referral procedures. Both sides discussed how to address rising antisemitism and Islamophobia around the world.

Emerging Technology

Oatar and the US held high-level interagency consultations on emerging technology – the first ever such session in a strategic dialogue with a regional partner. Both sides discussed the risks and benefits of Artificial Intelligence (AI). They decided to explore ways to deepen co-operation on emerging technologies to advance global health, food security, education, energy, and the fight against climate change.

Following the Letter of Intent on building strong World Cup legacies signed by HE Sheikh Mohamed and Blinken in 2022, the two sides convened a special strategic dialogue session devoted to World Cup "lessons learned" and knowledge transfer from the 2022 tournament in Doha on topics ranging from cybersecurity to major event organisation. Officials from the Governments of Canada and Mexico, co-hosts along with the US of the 2026 World Cup, also participated in the discussion along with representatives from US municipalities hosting games in 2026.
