





Pakistan-Qatar Bilateral Relations

'he brotherly relations between Pakistan and Qatar have flourished over the decades, founded on a profound mutual respect and shared Islamic heritage. These ties have been continuously nurtured through diplomatic engagements, economic cooperation, and cultural exchanges, strengthening the bond between the two nations.

As strategic partners, Pakistan and Qatar have demonstrated a commitment to enhancing their bilateral relationship, leveraging their svnergies to promote regional stability and mutual prosperity. This partnership, deeply rooted in Islamic brotherhood and strategic interests, serves as a cornerstone of their foreign relations, paving the way for a future of increased collaboration and shared successes.

Early Ties with Qatar

• Since Pakistan's emergence as an independent nation in 1947, it has actively nurtured its historical connections with the Islamic world, including the State of Qatar, which gained its independence in 1971. The establishment of diplomatic relations in 1973 laid a foundation built on mutual respect and Islamic brotherhood, celebrating over fifty years of diplomatic ties by 2023.

Political Engagements and Diplomatic Exchanges:

- The bilateral relationship has been significantly enriched by high-level visits and diplomatic exchanges. Notable visits by Qatar's leadership in 1999, 2015, and 2019, along with reciprocal visits by Pakistan's leadership, have solidified this bond. Successive visits by Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif to Qatar in 2022 and 2023 opened new opportunities for cooperation. During Prime Minister's visit to Doha in August 2022, Amir of Qatar Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani endorsed an initial investment of US \$ 3 billion in Pakistan, enhancing political and
- The Minister of State for Foreign Affairs of the State of Qatar, Dr. Mohammed bin Abdulaziz Al-Khulaifi visited Pakistan on 9 May 2024, as a special envoy of the Prime Minister and Foreign Minister of the State of Qatar Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrehman bin Jassim Al Thani. In Islamabad, the Minister of State called on Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif and Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Mohammad Ishaq Dar.
- Pakistan has consistently been an active participant in Qatar's multilateral initiatives. This includes regular involvement in the UN-convened meetings of Special Envoys on Afghanistan. The Pakistani delegation played a prominent role not only in the 2023 sessions but also in both the Doha-II and Doha-III meetings in 2024. Additionally, Pakistan has significantly contributed to other platforms such as the Doha Forum and the Oatar Economic Forum.
- Over the years, Pakistan and Qatar have signed more than 40 agreements and Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) to enhance cooperation across various sectors including politics, economy, defense, culture, media, and more.

Defense:

- Defense relations have been robust, characterized by joint military exercises, personnel training, and strategic military engagements. The collaboration was notably visible during the FIFA World Cup 2022, where Pakistan played a pivotal role by deploying over 4,050 personnel to
- Last year, Pakistan had three major visits to Qatar: Chief of Army Staff General Asim Munir, Chairman Joint Chief of Staff Committee Gen Sahir Shamshad Mirza and Air Chief Marshal Zaheer Ahmed. From Qatar's side, Chief of Staff, Lt Gen (Pilot) Salem Hamad Eqail Al-Nabet, visited Pakistan on 10 October 2023. During his stay, he was conferred with Nishan-e-Imtiaz (military) by the President of Pakistan, in recognition of his services to enhancing cooperation between the armed forces of the two countries.
- This year, Admiral Naveed Ashraf NI(M) TBt, Chief of the Naval Staff Pakistan Navy visited Qatar. During the visit, CNS met with Chief of Staff Qatar Armed Forces, Lt Gen (Pilot) Salem Hamad Egail Al-Nabet, Commander Qatar Emiri Naval Forces, Staff Maj Gen (Sea) Abdullah

- Hassan Al Sulaiti, and Commander Joint Forces Maj General (Staff) Jassim bin Ali Al Attiyah. CNS also visited Mohammed Bin Ghanem Al Ghanem Naval Academy.
- In keeping with the traditional cooperation between the Armed Forces of the two brotherly nations, Pakistan Air Force participated in bilateral exercise ZILZAL-II with IF-17 thunder aircrafts under the title "Brothers in arms train together" in January 2024, while Pakistan Navy Ship TABUK and Submarine KHALID participated in DIMDEX 2024 held in March this

Economic Ties and Trade Relations

- Economically, Qatar is a vital partner in Pakistan's energy sector, with significant trade in LNG since 2015. In addition to cooperation in the LNG sector, the two countries have been exploring investment opportunities in food security, renewable energy, aviation, ports and shipping, media, tourism sectors, as well as IT, minerals and mining, further diversifying their economic interactions
- The bilateral total trade volume stands at US \$ 3.689 billion in FY 2023-24 with exports at US \$ 158.1million and imports at US \$ 3.5billion. Balance of trade is in Qatar's favor due to import of LNG and some petroleum products by Pakistan. Pakistan has been exporting fruits, vegetables, fresh and frozen fish and other food items to Qatar.

Mango Festival

- This year, the Embassy of Pakistan and the Celebrations Organizing Committee of the Private Engineering Office (PEO) jointly organized The Al Hamba Festival of Pakistani mangoes, from 27 June to 6 July 2024, at Souq Waqif, Doha. The event was part of the Embassy's initiatives in economic diplomacy, with a special focus on introducing quality fresh fruits and products to the Qatari market. The first-of-its-kind event brought together 50 Pakistani and local companies, presenting around 100 outlets. The exhibition received an overwhelming response from residents and visitors alike who had the opportunity to acquire the finest of Pakistani mangoes which were shipped daily via air freight.
- The festival recorded unprecedented sales of more than 225,000 kg of Pakistani mangoes during the 10-day exhibition. The mango fiesta gained immense popularity in Doha and was widely covered by the local print and
- Pakistan has also been an active participant in Qatar's economic, trade and other events, including Agritech, Project Qatar Cityscape, Hunting Exhibitions etc.

Diaspora and Human Resource Exchange:

- Qatar is home to a significant Pakistani expatriate community of almost 300,000. The substantial Pakistani diaspora in Qatar acts as a vital bridge between the two nations, contributing significantly to Qatar's development and forming a crucial link in bilateral relations. This community is pivotal in sectors ranging from construction to finance, underscoring the deep interpersonal connections that complement formal diplomatic ties.
- Pakistanis have been coming to Qatar in large numbers, touching the historical high figures of 37,987 (2021), 58,000 (2022). According to the Bureau of Emigration & Overseas Employment, in 2023, around 55,112 Pakistanis came to Qatar for work opportunities. The presence of a large diaspora in Qatar has made the country an important source of remittances for Pakistan. In the FY 2022-23, Pakistani community in Oatar sent almost USD 1 billion of remittances back to Pakistan.

Education Cooperation & Development Assistance:

Qatar's commitment to development in Pakistan, particularly in education, has been a significant component of bilateral cooperation. Through the Doha-based Education Above All (EAA) foundation and the Qatar Fund for Development (QFFD), Qatar has launched multiple initiatives aimed at improving educational access for out-of-school children in Pakistan. Since 2012, EAA has impacted the lives of approximately 1.33 million out-of-



school children and has allocated over \$36 million to various educational projects.

Additionally, EAA has invested \$124 million into its "Educate a Child" program, significantly enhancing educational opportunities for these children. In terms of development aid, Qatar has been actively involved in several impactful projects across Pakistan, facilitated by Qatar Charity and the Qatar Fund for Development. During the International Conference on Climate Resilient Pakistan, held in Geneva on January 9, 2023, Qatar committed \$25 million to aid flood relief efforts in Pakistan. Furthermore, in partnership with UNICEF, Qatar Charity has implemented various water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) projects in Punjab's Rajanpur district, benefiting over 55,000 individuals affected by the catastrophic floods of 2022.

Cultural Cooperation

The cultural relationship between Pakistan and Qatar has been characterized by vibrant exchanges. Qatar has displayed a strong interest





in Pakistani arts, crafts, and culinary traditions, collaborating with Pakistan's Ministry of Culture and local organizations to organize a variety of cultural events that celebrate this shared heritage. This year, Qatar Museums is set to host a grand three-month exhibition on Pakistani Art and Architecture.

Conclusion

As the relationship between Pakistan and Qatar continues to evolve, it promises even greater collaboration and mutual growth in the future. Rooted in a shared historical and cultural legacy and strengthened by strategic mutual interests, this relationship is poised to reach new heights, offering a model of international partnership and cooperation.

he Al Hamba Festival for Pakistani mangoes delighted mango enthusiasts and food lovers alike with a vibrant celebration of the Pakistani mango season. The 10-day exhibition, which started on June 27 and ran until July 6, featured a wide range of products from 50 companies and 100 stalls.

Organized by the Embassy of Pakistan in Doha, in collaboration with the Celebrations Organizing Committee of the Private Engineering Office (PEO), this highly anticipated event showcased the rich variety and diverse flavors of Pakistani mangoes.

The first edition of the Mango Festival was attended by dignitaries, including HE the Director of Protocol Department in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Ibrahim Yousif Fakhroo; Private Engineering Office managing director Nasser Rashid al-Naimi; Pakistani Ambassador Muhemmed Aejaz; several ambassadors from various missions in Doha; and other guests.

In addition to mango sales, the festival also included culinary demonstrations, offering a holistic experience of Pakistani culture. Numerous business inquiries and potential partnerships were initiated, paving the way for future trade opportunities.

The festival received extensive media coverage, with reports highlighting the overwhelming response and the high quality of mangoes on offer. Notable print media and social outlets shared articles and posts praising the festival's success and its contribution to strengthening Pakistan-Qatar trade relations. The audience lived a unique experience purchasing the finest types of Pakistani mangoes that were supplied daily via air freight specifically for the exhibition"





Asking the Right Questions: TNG Teach Students the Power of Inquiry

orn with a natural curiosity, children love asking questions to sate their inquisitiveness but as they grow this act of asking questions is often repressed on account of being too daunting. However, as educators of the next generation of leaders and thinkers, we recognise that asking questions should be promoted and, more importantly, the art of asking the right questions should be practised to unlock higher learning.

At The Next Generation School, this inquisitiveness is encouraged and nurtured by creating an environment questions are a powerful tool to build a solid foundation for learning.

The key lies in asking the right questions that stem from genuine curiosity and unlock knowledge. Teachers at TNG encourage students to ask the right questions as the first step in honing their critical thinking skills, creating space for learners to reflect on bigger ideas and their assumptions to analyse and gain a deeper understanding of the world



Asking questions is the pursuit of knowledge and wisdom

For pupils in the modern age, mastering the art of asking the right questions allows them to bridge and cross the gap between simply accepting information and critical analysis and synthesis. Across all lessons, critical thought is encouraged by unpacking and identifying the core components of an argument as well as its salient features such as manipulations, biases and fallacies, which equips students with the ability adapt and respond to issues in life at work by intelligently analysing the data they are



Preparing students for the fast-paced and ever-changing real world starts with nurturing their curiosity, pushing them to master the art of asking the right questions and become critical thinkers that identify real world problems, engage with big picture ideas and are adept problem solvers

Through research projects that students take on at TNG during the annual Youth Leadership Programme, they engage in research as a precursor to asking open ended questions that foster dialogue and discourse at all levels. Through asking the rights questions which emerge from a place of honest curiosity, students are able to engage in the lower levels of Bloom's taxonomy to fill in gaps in their knowledge and are also able to attain higher educational learning objectives of evaluation and creation putting forward creative solutions to the problems that they observe around them.

Questions are beneficial tools in the learning process and when optimised they become uniquely powerful, enabling students to think critically, engage with issues and spur action benefiting them, their communities and the world at large and ultimately embodying the spirit of leadership

arachi Shipyard & Engineering Works (KS&EW) is a Public Limited Company established in 1956, operating under the administrative control of the Ministry of Defence Production (MoDP), Government of Pakistan. The vision of KS&EW is to make Pakistan a leading shipbuilding country in the region, aligning with its true potential and ideal geographical location.

KS&EW is a dynamic and adaptive organization with extensive technical and professional capabilities. It is the sole shipyard in Pakistan and one of the largest industrial engineering complexes in the country, situated at West Wharf, Karachi, and spanning an area of 71 acres. In addition to shipbuilding, KS&EW possesses the necessary infrastructure and facilities for Submarine Construction, Ship Repairs/ Refurbishment, Ship Lift & Transfer System (SLTS), and Heavy General Engineering works.

The management of KS&EW is focused on delivering quality products and services with 100% customer satisfaction, ensuring compliance with all domestic and international standards. KS&EW is International Management System (IMS) certified by Lloyd's Register, UK, including ISO 9001:2015, ISO 14001:2015, and ISO 45001:2018. Furthermore, all shipbuilding projects are certified by Classification Societies at various stages of construction (e.g., CCS,



Lloyd's Register, BV, and Türk Loydu), according to customer requirements.

KS&EW has built over 500 ships of various designs, sizes, and capacities for esteemed



domestic customers, including the Pakistan Navy, Pakistan National Shipping Corporation, Karachi Port Trust, Port Qasim Authority, Gwadar Port Authority, Pakistan Customs, Pakistan Maritime Security Agency, Pakistan Army, as well as several international clients from countries such as Saudi Arabia, Belgium, China, Iran, and the UAE.

The Shipbuilding Division is capable of constructing all types of commercial and naval platforms up to 26,000 DWT, including marine crafts, large ocean-going vessels, container ships, oil tankers, ferries, bulk carriers, corvettes, frigates, fast attack crafts, fleet tankers, gunboats, tugs, pilot boats, and more.



Recently, KS&EW has completed several key projects for valued customers such as the Pakistan Navy, Pakistan Army, and Pakistan



Maritime Security Agency, including:

- PNS MOAWIN (17,000 Tons Fleet Tanker).
- PMSS KOLACHI (1,500 Tons Maritime Petrol Vessel).
- PNS HAIBAT, PNS DEHSHAT & PNS HIMMAT (Fast Attack Craft Missile FAC(M)).
- PMSS ZHOBPN Fleet Tanker
- 01 x 48 Tons BP Tug.
- 03 x 16 Tons BP Tugs.
- 02 x 9 Tons BP Harbour Tugs/ Mooring Boats.



Recent significant achievements in shipbuilding include:

KS&EW has delivered to the Pakistan Navy the first-ever indigenously designed and constructed Fast Attack Craft (Missile) without any foreign collaboration. The vessel, known as KoM, was procured by KS&EW and comprises several locally developed components. It is also equipped with the state-of-the-art, indigenously developed Harbah Weapon System.



The launching of two MILGEM Class Corvettes, PNS TARIQ (DESIG) and PNS KHAIBAR (DESIG). These ships are fully equipped with modern weapons and sensors, capable of responding to maritime threats. The delivery of these ships is scheduled for 2025 and 2026, respectively.



Keel laying of 1stindigenously designed Gun Boat by Platform Design Wing of Pakistan Navy has been completed, construction is in full swing and this boat will be delivered in 2025.

KS&EW has achieved another landmark of technical expertise with the massive infrastructural up gradation for Submarine Construction facility in accordance with the service line and has been entrusted to undertake the construction of submarines for Pakistan Navy. As a part of Pakistan's largest defense



contract, Pakistan and China are simultaneously undertaking the construction of 08Hangor Class AIP Submarines,04 in China and 04in Pakistan. KS&EW has successfully completed the Keel Laying of 02 x Submarines and production work is being undertaken as per schedule.



Ship Repair division also has a comprehensive setup for the repairing, rebuilding and overhauling of naval and commercial vessels in compliance with high quality standards. These integrated services are provided through highly qualified and trained workforce. Facilities include 02 Dry docks, 02 Quay Walls and luffing cranes / lifting equipment along-with modern tools for the above and under water repairs.



KS&EW also undertakes steel renewal, major structural repairs, machinery -overhauls and repairs for our domestic customers i.e., Pakistan Navy, Pakistan Maritime Security Agency, Karachi Port Trust, Port Qasim Authority and various international customers including China, Turkey, Singapore, Korea and UAE. To date, KS&EW has repaired over 5000 vessels including more than 250 foreign flag carriers as well.

In order to enhance ship repair and refurbishment capacity to cater the regional demands, a state-of-the-art Ship Lift & Transfer System (SLTS) has been commissioned at KS&EW by M/s Syncrolift (OEM), Norway. This system is fully operational and capable to lift ships up to 7300 tons on 12 dedicated parking stations for under-water repairs.

General Engineering Division is capable to undertake marine structural fabrication projects (Dams/ Barrage Gates), cranes and lifting equipment (Electric overhead, Luffing and Gantry cranes etc.), stadiums flood light towers (football / cricket / hockey) and wind turbine towers. Also machining works includes forged steel shafts, sugar rollers and hoisting mechanism for dams / barrages, rollers for sugar plants and foundry products from GE includes steel billets sugar rollers and alloys casting.

One of the biggest milestone achievements of General Engineering Division is the installation and commissioning of O6River Barrage Gates at Sukkur Barrage for M/s Sindh Barrage Improvement Projects, Sindh Irrigation Dept. (Govt. of Sindh); with Project Consultant M/s ACE-NDC (JV) Australia; under the overall project management by World Bank.

Recently KS&EW installed 01 x River Barrage Gate on emergent basis which included complete 50 tons gate new fabrication, dismantling of damaged gate from Bay 47 at Sukkur Barrage and installation and commissioning of new gate in less than one month. This proves the capability of KS&EW to react and response during national emergencies amicably.

Material testing laboratory of KS&EW was established in 1959, offering services of metallurgical analysis, mechanical, physical, chemical, welding tests, chemical composition, testing of metals, ferrous and non-ferrous, alloys, refractory and cement etc. All tests are carried out in accordance with BSS/ASTM standards and/or any other classification / standard to comply customer's specific requirement.

Shipyard Training School (STS) was established in 1957 as an apprentice training school for Marine Engineers. STS is also contributing for the skill development programs. Currently, STS is offering various diplomas and vocational courses in electrical, mechanical and ship construction technologies. STS has so far trained more than 25,000 young entrants and also offering internship programs like MTOs and MTSs for fresh graduates and associates. STS is also certified / authorized by Saudi authority to conduct TAKAMOL - skill verification program by Saudi Government (trades includes welding, crane operator, building &industrial electrician, machinist, moulding/casting &plumbing) and German's authority TUV Rhineland's program (Level 1: Metal fabrication).

KS&EW can offer customized training from basics to advance level to HR of marine organization/ shipyard, as per requirements at STS and/ or at their yards. Furthermore, hands on training may also be arranged on vessels under construction at KS&EW.



Recently signed contracts:

Contract for construction of 01 x Jinnah Class Frigate for Pakistan Navy has been awarded to KS&EW. This will be the first totally indigenous designed and constructed platform of this size. Presently our design team is engaged with M/s ASFAT for joint design effort. The construction time of this vessel is 52 months.

Contract for construction and delivery of 02 x Fast Response Boats for Pakistan Maritime Security Agency was awarded in January 2024. Construction has commenced and delivery of 1st and 2nd boat is planned after 8 and 11 months respectively from start of aluminum cutting.






Welcome to the Land of Beauty



BEAUTIFUL KARAKORAMS

The Karakorams which means 'black mountains', lying to the north of the western Himalays, stretch for nearly 300 miles from the eastern most part of Afghanistan in a south eastern direction. Having a width of 150 miles, the Karakorams consist of a group of parallel ranges with several spurs. Only the central part is a monolithic rage. Sprawling nearly over 35 and 33 N latitude and lying roughly between 74 and 78 E longitude, the Karakorams are one of the highest mountain systems of 24,000 feet (7320 metres) or above, and four of them are above 26,000 feet (7930 meters). No other mountain system has such a large number of high peaks above 7000 meters. Craggy peaks and steep slopes are characteristic of the range. These mountains also from the boundary between China and the Northern Areas of Gilgit and Baltistan controlled by Pakistan.

Broad Peak

Board peak is the 12th highest mountain in the world at 8,075 meters above sea level. Broad peak is part of the Gasherbrum massif in Baltistan on the border of Pakistan and China. It is located in the Karakoram mountain range about 8 kilometers (5.0 mi) from K2. It has a summit over 1.5 kilometres (0.93 mi) long. The mountain has several summits: Broad Peak (8047 m), Rocky Summit (8028 m), Broad Peak central (8011 m), Broad Peak North (7490 m), and Kharut Kangri (6942 m).

Gasherbrum-I

Gasherbrum-I is part of the Gasherbrum massif, located in the Karakoram region of the Himalaya. Gasherbrum is often claimed to mean "Shining Wall", presumably a reference to the highly visible face of the neighboring peak Gasherbrum IV; but in fact it comes from "rgasha" (beautiful) + "brum" (mountain) in Balti, hence it actually means "beautiful mountain."



Nanga Parbat

Nanga Parbat literally, Naked Mountain is the ninth highest mountain in the world at 8,126 meters (26,660 ft) above sea level. It is the western anchor of the Himalays around which the Indus river skirts into the plains of Pakistan. It is located in the Gilgit-Baltistan region of Pakistan and is locally known as 'Deo Mir' 'Deo' meaning 'huge' 'mir' meaning 'mountain'.

K2, also known as Mount Godwin-Austen or Chhogori is the second highest mountain in the world, after Mount Everest, at 8,611 metres above sea level. It is located on the China-Pakistan border between Baltistan, in the Gilgit-Baltistan region of northern Pakistan.

Fosco Mariant, the Italian mountaineer, describes k-2 as "the very Patriarch of Mountains, regal, serene, a mountain conceived on a giant scale, given the space and setting that are meet and right for a giant. In the mighty mass of the whole, each single part seems so finely wrought, each one a telling note in a mighty chord, and in the patterning of ridge, colour, rock face and ice fall, thrusting inexorably upwards to the peak, there is the logic of Bach fugue.






