
Visit Qatar unveils new global drive

6 dead in shooting attack in Tel Aviv


At least six people were killed and nine wounded in a shooting and stabbing attack in Tel Aviv yesterday. Israeli police said two men started a killing spree on the Tel Aviv light rail and continued on foot before being killed by civilians and inspectors using personal pistols. There has been no claim of responsibility. Paramedics provided on-site treatment to a number of wounded people with varying degrees of injuries, including some who were unconscious.

Iran fires scores of missiles at Israel

Tran launched around 180 missiles at Israel yesterday in response to the killings of Tehran-backed militant leaders, prompting alarm across the region and vows of retaliation.

Most of the missiles were intercepted by Israeli air defences or by allied air forces before they reached Israel.

"Missiles were launched from Iran towards the State of Israel," the Israeli military said in a statement, as sirens sounded nationwide, announcing after about an hour that the attack was over with a "large number" of missiles intercepted.

Israeli medics reported two people were lightly injured by shrapnel in the country's centre, while in the occupied West Bank, a Palestinian was killed in Jericho "when pieces of a rocket fell from the sky and hit him".

It was Iran's second direct attack on Israel after a missile and drone attack in April in response to a deadly Israeli air strike on the Iranian consulate in Damascus.

Iran's Revolutionary Guards said they had launched a missile attack on "three military bases" around

Israel's commercial hub Tel Aviv.
They said the attack was in response to Israel's killing of Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah last week as well as the death of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh in a Tehran bombing widely blamed on Israel.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said the Iranian attack was "unacceptable" and called on the whole world to condemn it.

Israeli airspace was closed for several hours with all flights diverted.

Iraq, Lebanon and Jordan, which lie between Iran and Israel, closed their airspace too.

As the missiles made their way to Israel from the east, blasts were heard over the Jordanian capital Amman, as Israel's allies moved to intercept them.

Jordan said its air defences responded to missiles and drones.

US President Joe Biden ordered the military to "aid Israel's defence" and shoot down Iranian

US to co-ordinate response to Iran attacks with Israel

The United States said yesterday that Iran must suffer "consequences" for its ballistic missile attack on Israel and the United States will co-ordinate a response with Israeli officials. "Of course, there must be consequences for Iran for this attack," State Department spokesman Matthew Miller told reporters. "I'm not going to get into what those consequences are today, but there are things on which we will be co-ordinating with our Israeli counterparts," Miller said.

Israeli military spokesman Daniel Hagari said the latest Iranian "attack will have consequences. We have plans, and we will operate at the place and time we decide".

Israel carrying out 'limited, targeted' ground operations in South Lebanon

troops had carried out raids against Hezbollah in south Lebanon and mobilised more forces, despite calls for de-escalation after a week of air strikes that killed hundreds.

The scope of the Israeli offensive was not immediately clear, with the UN peacekeeping mission in Lebanon saying it did not amount to a "ground incursion" and Hezbollah denying any troops had crossed the border.

Since an army statement early yesterday confirmed troops had started "targeted ground raids" in south Lebanon, across Israel's northern border, officials have provided few details of the extent of the operation or its timeframe.

An Israeli security official said localised raids had

taken place and that they were limited in scope. A Lebanese army source said the force had "not observed any penetration by Israeli enemy forces into Lebanese territory".

17 of a Lebanese family killed in Israeli strike

Qassem al-Qadhi left his home in east Lebanon this weekend to buy bread for 17 family members, but when he returned they were all dead. An Israeli air strike on Sunday hit the village of Zaboud in the Bekaa valley, killing a whole family, the national news agency NNA said. Qadhi said it was his wife, children and grandchildren. They were killed in an instant. The 57-year-old says the only member of the family who survived was his 25-year-old son Hussein, who had headed off to do his military service just before the strike. "Seventeen people – including my son's fiancee and her mother, my wife, my three sons and two daughters, and seven grandchildren," al-Qadhi said.

sraeli air strikes killed at least 37 people in Gaza yesterday, local medics said and fighting ramped up, as the Israeli military said it had been targeting command centres used by Palestinian

resistance movement Hamas.
Palestinian health officials said at least 13 people, including women and children, were killed in two Israeli strikes on two houses in Nuseirat, one of the enclave's

eight historic refugee camps.

Another strike on a school sheltering displaced Palestinian families in the Tuffah neighbourhood of Gaza City killed at least seven

of Gaza City killed at least seven people, medics added. Later yesterday, two separate Israeli attacks killed five Palestinians in Rafah in the southern Gaza

ians in Rafah in the southern Gaza Strip and in the Zeitoun suburb of Gaza City, medics said.

In Khan Younis, in the south of the enclave, six Palestinians were killed in an Israeli air strike on a tent housing displaced people, medics said.

Hours later, an Israeli air strike on a car in western Khan Younis, killed six Palestinians, medics said.

Israel's war on Gaza has devastated Gaza, displacing most of its 2.3mn population.

The health ministry in Hamasrun Gaza said that at least 41,638 people have been killed in the war, now in its 12th month. It said 96,460 people have been wounded in the Gaza Strip since the war began on October 7.

Some Palestinians said they feared that Israel's shift in focus to Lebanon could prolong the conflict in Gaza, which marks its first anniversary next week.

"The eyes of the world now are on Lebanon while the occupation continues its killing in Gaza. We are afraid the war is going to go on for more months at least," said Samir Mohammed, 46, a father of five from Gaza City.

Al-Khulaifi meets US official



HE the Minister of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Dr Mohammed bin Abdulaziz bin Saleh al-Khulaifi met yesterday in Washington with Deputy Assistant to the President and senior adviser for energy and security Amos Hochstein. The meeting dealt with discussing the strategic relationship between Qatar and the US and the means to enhance them. The meeting also dealt with the latest developments in Gaza and Lebanon, in addition to several issues of joint interest. HE Dr al-Khulaifi reiterated Qatar's position in support of Lebanon, stressing the need for concerted regional and international efforts to reduce escalation and enhance the security and stability of the region. Doha hosts international workshop on micro-mobility systems development

n collaboration with the Min-istry of Transport, the Qatar Transportation and Traffic Safety Center at the College of Engineering at Qatar University (QU) organised an international workshop on the development of micro-mobility systems. The workshop, which was held at the university's research facilities, gathered over 400 experts, researchers, and industry leaders from more than 65 countries.

The workshop featured participation and sponsorship from prestigious global organisations in transportation engineering, including the International Association of Traffic and Safety Sciences (IATSS), the International Road Federation (IRF), the World Conference on Transport Research Society (WCTRS), as well as local and international companies such as Traffic Tech (Gulf) and CDM Smith.

The workshop featured in-depth discussions with experts and researchers focused on developing micro-mobility systems, including bicycles and similar urban modes like scooters. It explored the challenges associated with micro-mobility, such as the need for adequate infrastructure and the regulatory



frameworks that govern their usage, aiming to improve transport network efficiency and reduce their impact on traffic safety. Extensive discussion and exchanges of ideas occurred among international experts, speakers from scientific and global organisations, and representatives from both the governmental and private sectors.

The workshop also included a session on the "Update of the Qatar Bicycle Master Plan," an ongoing initiative by the Ministry of Transport, to discuss some of its outputs and exchange views with pertinent governmental and private sector representatives.

Dean of the College of Engineering at OU Dr Khalid Kamal Naji emphasised the importance of collaboration between the university, the Ministry of Transport, and global organisations, stating. "This international event is the result of the ongoing collaboration between Qatar University, the Ministry of Transport, leading global organisations in transportation engineering, and private sector consulting firms. It aims to ensure a practical and effective impact from the advanced research studies conducted by the college to find innovative solutions based on best global practices for the contemporary challenges facing transportation systems in the country and the world. The participation of a distinguished group of faculty members, researchers, and graduate students from the university in this workshop is a testament to the college's commitment to transportation and traffic safety research and its collaboration with governmental and private entities in this field."

Director of Land Transport Planning at the Ministry of Transport Saleh Said al-Marri said that the Ministry of Transport is taking significant steps to enhance the land transport system in Qatar, with the goal of establishing a comprehensive and sustainable transport network that includes bicycles and micro-mobility options.

Director-General of the International Road Federation (IRF) Susanna Zammataro discussed the challenges facing road authorities worldwide, saying, "The rapid and widespread adoption of micro-mobility solutions in numerous countries presents considerable challenges for road authorities, particularly in terms of safety. We are delighted to work with the Qatar Transportation and Traffic Safety Center to identify the suitable solutions in terms of infrastructure, technology, and traffic management that will help us save precious lives. Events like this one are crucial to exchange knowledge, foster collaboration, and enhance impactful action on these issues." (ONA)

Qatar Airways to acquire 25% 'stake' in Virgin Australia

he existing partnership between Virgin Australia and Qatar Airways will be strengthened with the announcement that Qatar Airways Group intends to acquire a minority 25% equity stake in Virgin Australia from Bain Capital (subject to FIRB approval). Qatar Airways is one of the world's largest airlines and earlier this year was awarded the world's best airline by Skytrax for the eighth time.

"A deeper strategic relationship between Virgin Australia and Qatar Airways will drive increased competition in Australian aviation. This will ensure Australian consumers have access to even better value airfares and greater choice," Qatar Airways said in a statement yesterday.

"Domestic competition in Australia is dependent on Virgin Australia thriving through the inevitable ups and downs of aviation. Qatar Airways Group's strategic investment will provide access to the critical scale and expertise of a world leading global airline.

"The minority stake also serves as a cornerstone investment ahead of an anticipated return of Virgin Australia into public ownership and the opportunity that would provide for Australians to share in Virgin Australia's future," the national airline said. The equity investment by Qatar Airways Group will unlock new areas of co-operation with Virgin Australia, all of which will help to drive additional consumer

and economic benefits. Subject to ACCC authorisation, this co-operation will enable Virgin Australia to launch flights from Brisbane, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney to Doha, connecting seamlessly into Qatar Airways' global network. These extra flights will open up more than 100 new connecting itineraries across Europe, the Middle East and Africa for Australian travellers.

The proposed wet lease services will begin in mid-2025, allowing Virgin Australia to assess the longerterm merits and viability of wide-body aircraft flying while providing Australians with greater local competition for their long-haul travel needs in the near-term.

The expanded codeshare and

collaboration arrangement will provide access to a greater range of international destinations with improved schedules and frequencies, increased earn and redemption opportunities for members of Velocity and Qatar Airways' Privilege Club, and broader access to great value fares for leisure travellers, small and medium-sized enterprises, and corporate customers. The deepened partnership has the potential to underpin significant jobs and economic growth, not just in Virgin Australia but across both the broader aviation and tourism sectors in Australia. An important area of future focus is sustainability, including the development of Sustainable Aviation Fuel. The partnership also comes at a great time to explore



opportunities as the new Western Sydney Airport and its economic ecosystem are developed.

Qatar Airways Group Chief Executive Officer Badr Mohammed al-Meer said: "We are really pleased to be announcing our proposed strategic investment in Virgin Australia today. Ministry announces update to the list of registered experts

He stressed the ministry's keenness to strengthen the national cadre of experts and provide expertise that keeps pace with the comprehensive renaissance witnessed by the country in all fields, particularly in rare technical fields, by creating a roster system for documenting various areas of expertise and establishing guidelines

He pointed out that experts will take a legal oath to expedite procedures and improve access to specialised services for stakeholders. Al-Marri outlined the extensive qualifications available, which include accounting, engineering (mechanical, electrical, architectural), real estate valuation, food safety, alternative energies, and more. He noted that this expertise also covers niche areas such as financial and banking services, project management, agricultural affairs, and counterfeiting investigations.

He concluded by mentioning that the expertise encompasses specialized fields relevant to various societal needs, including the export of used oils, recycling activities, public relations, event organization, and livestock management, among others. (QNA)

























QNB celebrates 'back to school' season with QF

QRCS begins Warm Winter Campaign

Drive aims to benefit 179,000 in 13 countries

atar Red Crescent Society (QRCS) has launched the Warm Winter Campaign 2024-2025, under the slogan "Their Warmth Is Our Duty."

QRCS has been launching its annual charity campaign during this time each year.

The QRCS secretary-general stressed the campaign's significance by stating, "These facts show the importance of this campaign, and other humanitarian and relief interventions, to alleviate the suffering of affected people, trying to meet their needs, and to enhance their resilience and steadfastness."

Director of Communication and Fundraising Division at QRCS Mohamed Ahmed al-Bishri explained some facts and information about the Warm Winter Campaign involving 13 countries namely Qatar, Palestine (including the Gaza Strip and the West Bank), Yemen, Syria, Niger, Sudan, Somalia, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Lebanon, Jordan, Albania, and Kosovo.

Mexico's first woman president takes office

laudia Sheinbaum (**pictured**) was sworn in as Mexico's woman president yesterday, taking the reins at a time the country is struggling with violence from organised crime and a hefty deficit in Latin America's No 2 economy.

Sheinbaum, the 62-year-old scientist and former mayor of Mexico City, was inaugurated in a ceremony in Mexico's Congress for a six-year term lasting until 2030.

Her supporters chanted "President! President!" and "Long live Mexico!" after Sheinbaum took the oath of office in front of lawmakers. She will later attend a celebration in Mexico City's main square as leader of the world's most populous Spanish-speaking country, home to 129mn people, which has had 65 male presidents since in-

Supporters began gathering from dawn on inauguration day, which authorities declared a national holiday.

"We arrived at five in the morning," said Marta Ramirez, a house-wife who came by bus from the central city of Leon.

A woman president "understands the people better", she said. Sheinbaum has said on several occasions that "it's time for women and transformation" in Mexico, a nation with a history of genderbased discrimination and violence, with around 10 women or girls murdered every day.

Political watchers and analysts predict Sheinbaum will urgently look to calm investors following the passing of a controversial judicial reform pushed by her predecessor Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador.

Markets will be looking to Sheinbaum for "a predictable and investment-friendly policy and regulatory framework", said Alberto Ramos, head of Goldman Sachs Latin American economic research.

"Disciplined management of the budget and of state-owned enterprises, progress on public security, and safe-guarding the integrity of key institutions will be key to preserving market sentiment and sovereign debt ratings," Ramos said, emphasising the importance of state energy firm Petroleos Mexicanos (Pemex).

The November presidential elections in the United States, Mexico's largest trading partner, could add to market volatility, especially if former president Donald Trump, who has vowed to increase tariffs on Mexican goods, wins.

Sheinbaum's government will present its first budget before November 15, which is expected to be highly scrutinised for clues on whether Sheinbaum will make good on commitments to reduce the fiscal deficit to 3.5% of gross domestic product from 5.9%, where it is predicted to close the year.

Lopez Obrador, whose six-year term began in 2018, managed to double Mexico's minimum wage, reduce poverty and unemployment, broaden the base of social programmes and oversee a previous strengthening of the peso.

Touting these successes boosted his popularity and helped usher Sheinbaum, his protégée, to a landslide victory in the June elections. Sheinbaum, however, who has promised "continuity with change", will inherit the largest budget deficit since the 1980s and lagging eco-

nomic growth. Experts have said Mexico's economy will require a tax reform to increase revenues, though Sheinbaum has said publicly she does not plan a sweeping tax overhaul.

Instead, she has said she will pursue other options, including improving the efficiency of tax collection at customs.

New Nato chief Rutte dismisses Trump fears

ew Nato chief Mark Rutte (pictured) has downplayed fears over a potential Donald Trump victory in the US presidential election and pledged to keep backing Ukraine, as he assumed leadership of the world's most powerful military alliance.

The former Dutch prime minister steps into the role at a pivotal moment, as Russia presses its war in Ukraine, China flexes its growing might - and just weeks before US voters choose a new leader.

"I'm determined to prepare Nato for the challenges of the future," Rutte said as he formally took over as secretary general from Norway's Jens Stoltenberg at the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (Nato)'s Brussels headquarters.

The outcome of the November 5 US vote is set to be the straight-talking 57-year-old's first major test - and will shape his initial four-year

On the campaign trail, former president Trump has threatened not to protect Nato members who do not spend enough on defence and promised a quick deal with Russian President Vladimir Putin to end to the war in

"I'm not worried. I know both candidates very well. I worked for four years with Donald Trump. He was the one pushing us to spend more, and he achieved," Rutte said. "I will be able to work with both, whatever is the outcome of the elections."

In opting for the veteran Dutch statesman, a staunch US ally and stalwart backer of Ukraine,

Nato's 32 nations have picked a leader who will keep pushing support for Kyiv and efforts to bolster the alliance's own defences against Rus-

"Nato will be in safe hands with you at the helm," said Stoltenberg, who has guided the alliance through one of its most tumultuous dec-

US President Joe Biden said he had full confidence that Rutte "will continue to build on our work to create a Nato that is stronger, larger, and more resolute than ever".

Rutte listed Ukraine among his priorities along with ensuring Nato keeps on spending more on defence, and bolstering ties with partners, including the European Union and those in the Asia Pacific. "Putin has to realise that we will not give

in, that we want Ukraine to prevail in the end," Rutte warned, saying that he wanted "to step up our support for Ukraine and bring it ever closer to Nato".

"We must sustain this support into the future, because Ukraine's rightful place is in Nato," he added.

Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky pledged to work with Rutte as his country "continues on its path towards full-fledged Nato membership".

Kyiv faces difficulties as Russian forces advance on the battlefield more than two-and-ahalf years after the Kremlin's all-out invasion. And there is uncertainty over future West-

resolution to the conflict. "It's up to the Ukrainian government to decide when they are at a stage that they want to discuss peace," Rutte said. "That's for later."

Another central task for Rutte will be to keep pushing Nato members to carry on increasing military spending to counter any potential menace from Moscow.

"One thing will not change, and that is Nato's core mission, and that is to make sure that we defend our people, our nations, and, of course, our values," Rutte said.

At least 23 killed in Thai bus inferno

devastating fire on a Thai school bus killed at least A school bus kined at 2012 23 people, police said yesterday after rescuers pulled children's bodies from the charred wreckage of the vehicle.

The inferno engulfed the coach on a highway in a northern Bangkok suburb as it carried 38 children - ranging from kindergarten age to young teenagers -

and six teachers on a school trip. It is believed to be the deadliest road accident in a decade in Thailand, which has one of the world's worst traffic safety records with around 20,000 fa-

"We found 23 bodies inside the bus," Trairong Phiwpan, head of the police forensic science office, told reporters.

The victims' bodies were so badly burned that Trairong said it was not yet possible to confirm how many were adults and how many children.

DNA testing would be needed to identify the remains, police said.

Rescue workers put up screens around the wreckage to shield firefighters and investigators as they recovered bodies from the blackened shell of the bus.

"Some of the bodies we rescued were very, very small. They must have been very young in age," Piyalak Thinkaew, who led the search, told reporters at the scene, adding that the fire started at the front of the bus.

"The kids' instinct was to escape to the back so the bodies were there," he said.

Police are hunting the coach driver after he fled the scene, acting national police chief Kitrat Phanphet told reporters.

"We are investigating all individuals, including the bus company to see if this was a case of negligence," he said. "The driver is on the run, we will not wait for him to turn himself in - we will send a team to find him."

Some of the children who survived suffered horrific burns to their faces, mouths and eyes, doctors treating them told local

The bus was one of three carrying children from Wat Khao Phraya Sangkharam school in the northern province of Uthai Thani on a field trip to a science museum in northern Bangkok.

A video posted on the school's Facebook page just hours before the tragedy shows the group of youngsters in orange uniform shirts stopping off at the ancient Thai capital of Ayutthaya.

The disaster is believed to have begun when one of the bus tyres burst on the highway around 12.30pm (0530 GMT), sending it crashing into a barrier and triggering the inferno, officials said. Video footage from the scene

showed flames engulfing the bus as it burned under an overpass, huge clouds of dense black smoke billowing into the sky.

The bus was a natural gas vehicle (NGV), according to Transport Minister Suriya Juangroon-

gruangkit. Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra visited survivors in hospital and said that the government would pay for medical

treatment and compensate the victims' families. "As a mother, I would like to express my deepest condolences to the families of the injured and deceased," she wrote on social

media platform X. Meechai Sa-ard, a motorbike taxi driver, heard the noise of the incident from a kilometre away.

"There was smoke everywhere. Poor children, I heard they were very little," he told AFP. "I was hoping that god would be kind so that the rain could put the fire out and the kids would survive."

Thailand has one of the worst road safety records in the world, with unsafe vehicles and poor driving contributing to the high annual death toll.

Around 20,000 people are killed every year on the kingdom's roads, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO) - more than 50 a day on average.

A similar bus fire killed 20 Myanmar migrant workers in March 2018, while at least 30 people died when a bus careered off a mountain road into a ravine four years earlier.

A flash flood that swept through

a southern city of Iran killed 15 people, state media reported of six dead.

"After finding the last body of Halil of 15 are pronounced dead," said the official IRNA news agency. The search and rescue operation had been brought to an end, it

Almost all of those killed in Monday's flood were Afghan nationals living in the Islamic republic, Iran's ISNA news agency reported. - AFP

Beyond serving as commander in chief for a single term from 1977-1981, Carter worked as a global mediator, rights activist and elder statesman, founding the 1982. His presidency included the

1978 Camp David Accords between Israel and Egypt, the establishment of diplomatic relations with China following a rapprochement initiated by president Richard Nixon, and the return of control of the Panama Canal to Panama.

However, his administration hit numerous snags, including the Iran hostage crisis and a renewed oil crisis in 1979-1980, which saw Ronald Reagan sweep into power.

According to family, Carter remains keenly interested in politics and was highly motivated to make it to 100 and to vote in the November election for fellow Democrat Kamala Harris.

Doctors in India's Kolkata resume full strike

'unior doctors in India's West Bengal state resumed their full strike yesterday, complaining that the country's judiciary has not made adequate efforts to restore justice after the rape and murder of a trainee doctor in August.

Doctors from the West Bengal Junior Doctors' Front, which represents about 7,000 physicians in the state, reinstated partial services last month, citing the flood situation in parts of the state.

The rape and murder of the 31-year-old female doctor in Kolkata, capital of the eastern state, set off a wave of protests by doctors demanding greater workplace safety for women and justice for their slain colleague, prompting India's Supreme Court to create a hospital safety task force.

The top court, in its latest hearing on Monday, urged the state government to put in place all measures by October 15 to meet the doctors' demands. It also asked the information ministry to ensure

the identity of the victim was concealed and not shared online as required by law.

The doctors, however, said they were disappointed with the court's decisions and were "compelled to return to a full ceasework".

"Unless we receive clear action from the government on safety, patient services, and the politics of fear, we will have no choice but to continue our full strike," the group said in a statement yesterday. The doctors' demands include increased police

protection in hospitals and investigation of what they say is corruption in several medical colleges. West Bengal, ruled by the regional Trinamool

Congress party, has been slow to create new tribunals to try sex crimes speedily, according to a Reuters report. Only six tribunals are operational in the state, a

far cry from the target of installing 123 fast-track tribunals by March 2021. - Reuters

Kenyan lawmakers seek to impeach deputy president

Kenyan lawmakers initiated a motion yesterday to impeach Deputy President Rigathi Gachagua. The East African country's politics has been in turmoil since March following deadly protests over a spiralling cost of living crisis and deeply unpopular tax hikes. Gachagua is accused of undermining the government, being involved in corruption, insubordination, practising ethnically divisive politics among a slew of other charges.

Some 291 members of parliament appended their signatures to support the motion, well beyond the 117 Gachagua, a businessman from the vote-rich Mt Kenya

region, has denied the allegations as politically charged.

Two London teens in hospital after suspected acid attack

A suspected acid attack outside a London school left two teenagers in hospital yesterday, one with potentially life-changing injuries, police said. Three people were injured when a substance was thrown at students and a staff member on Monday. "Tests of the substance are ongoing. At this stage officers believe it to be acidic," London police said in a statement, which noted a 14-year-old girl's injuries "may potentially be life-changing".

A 16-year-old boy, whose injuries were not lifechanging, was also in hospital after the incident at the Westminster Academy school in west London. The third victim, a woman aged 27, was discharged from hospital after suffering injuries not said to be lifechanging. - AFP

Boy 'seriously hurt' in Zurich stabbing attack on children

A stabbing attack on children heading to a Zurich daycare centre yesterday left one boy seriously wounded and two others injured, said police who detained a Chinese national.

The attack happened around midday on Berninastrasse, a largely residential street in the Oerlikon district in the north of Switzerland's biggest citv. "According to initial findings, a daycare worker was on

The children hurt in the attack were taken to hospital.

her way to a daycare centre with several children when a man suddenly attacked the children with a blade,' Zurich police said in a statement.

Police said a 23-year-old Chinese man was arrested and taken to a police station. - AFP

Shanghai knife attack leaves three dead, wounds 15 others

Three people were killed and 15 others injured in a knife attack at a suburban supermarket in Shanghai on Monday on the eve of China's week-long National Day holiday, the latest in a series of stabbing incidents in major Chinese cities this year.

The victims were rushed to hospital, but three died. The assailant, a 37-year-old man surnamed Lin, has been detained, local police of Songjiang district said in a statement vesterday.

According to an initial investigation by police, Lin had travelled to Shanghai to vent his anger following a personal financial dispute.

The knife attack came one day before China's National Day "Golden Week", when holiday travel was expected to surge. - Reuters

The bright-dim prospects of global EV transition

Just as road transportation accounts for about 15% of greenhouse gas emissions, so transitioning to cleaner vehicles is a linchpin in national efforts to meet climate-change mitigation

But the sales momentum for electric vehicles (EVs) is slowing globally.

For many years, governments offered generous subsidies to encourage drivers to switch to electric vehicles.

But this year, the EV transition is having a wobble. Governments are scaling back financial incentives for EV buyers, sales growth is stalling and the auto industry is having second thoughts about some of the investment plans that were predicated on a rapid shift to electric.

According to BloombergNEF, sales of all-electric vehicles plus plug-in hybrids that can also be powered by gasoline or diesel more than doubled in 2021 and grew 62% in 2022. But growth slowed to 31% last year.

China was the main driver, accounting for 59% of global sales, excluding commercial vehicles.

Most notably, in Europe and the US, the shift to EVs effectively went into reverse. The market share of battery cars in Europe shrank to 14% in August from just over 15% a year earlier. In Germany, the continent's biggest market, EV sales plunged

The global **EV** fleet will expand to over 132mn by **2027**, up from 41mn in 20 according to a BNEF report

On average, all-electric vehicles are 30% and 27% pricier in Europe and the US, respectively. There are cheaper EVs out there, namely in China.

Several manufacturers, including GM, Ford, Mercedes-Benz, Volvo and Toyota, have now softened their EV

Together, the legacy carmakers - those with a long history of making combus engine vehicles — are targeting 23.7mn EV sales in 2030, more than 3mn units fewer than they had forecast last year, according to BNEF.

Even Tesla, the pure-play EV maker that did much to make EVs a hit with drivers, has stopped referring to its goal of

delivering 20mn units a year by 2030.

There are some silver linings, though

Some governments alarmed by the recent downturn in EV demand are weighing whether to restore their financial incentives The auto industry operates on long product cycles. High-

volume automakers develop new platforms that underpin vehicles over what is usually a six- to 10-year period. The platforms take years to develop, cost billions of dollars and

ideally are versatile, allowing automakers to use different body structures catering to a wider variety of consumer preferences.

And all the work carmakers have done reconfiguring their factories to make EVs means they are getting closer to offering a wider selection of more affordable models to entice wavering In Europe, seven new electric models costing less than €25,000

(\$27,810) could hit the market this year and next, including a new Renault 5 and Stellantis' Citroen e-C3, according to the Transport & Environment lobby group.

In that optimistic scenario, EVs could grab as much as 24% of the European market next year, according to T&E, which advocates for clean transport and energy.

That would be a big leap from the 12.5% market share for EVs in

EU countries over the first seven months of 2024, as measured by the European Automobile Manufacturers' Association.

BNEF projects that global passenger EV sales will grow, though at a slower pace, rising from 13.9mn in 2023 to over 30mn by 2027. The annual growth rate will average 21%, down from 61% between

By 2027, EVs will comprise 33% of global new passenger vehicle sales, with China and Europe leading at 60% and 41%, respectively.

Overall, the global EV fleet will expand to over 132mn by 2027,

up from 41mn in 2023, according to a BNEF report in June. The long-term market outlook for electric vehicles is positive

despite near-term challenges.

VW labour clash spotlights Europe car factory enigma

olkswagen's showdown with powerful labour leaders over how to tackle spiralling costs at underused German factories has triggered intense soul-searching about the root causes of the carmaker's problems.

Complex governance structures, misjudged investments in EVs, poor management decisions, sliding revenues from China and Germany's crippling bureaucracy have all variously been blamed for the challenges facing the world's second-biggest automaker.

Yet a Reuters review of factory capacity utilisation data across Europe for six carmakers shows that Volkswagen is hardly at outlier and it may be in a better place than some of its major rivals when it comes to underused

Renault and Stellantis, for example, both have lower average capacity utilisation rates in Europe than VW, according to the figures compiled for Reuters by GlobalData, which included numbers for BMW, Ford and Mercedes-Benz as well.

Reuters also sourced data for all automakers in eight major European car-making countries: four in higher-cost states France, Germany, Italy and the UK - and four in lower-cost countries - Czech Republic, Slovakia, Spain and Turkiye.

That data showed that there was a clear tendency towards higher factory utilisation rates in central and eastern Europe, where costs are lower, suggesting the problems most of the big automakers face are mainly in their home markets.

Across Europe, the capacity utilisation of factories making light vehicles such as passenger cars was 60% in 2023, down from 70% in 2019, the data showed.

In the lower-cost countries, the average utilisation rate slipped only slightly to 79% from 83%, but in the higher cost countries, plant use dropped to just 54% from 65%.

A utilisation rate of around 70% is considered the minimum for profitability, depending on the vehicle, according to GlobalData. Around 80-90% is seen as cost-effective, providing some flexibility for model changeovers and maintenance.

Volkswagen, Stellantis and Mercedes-Benz said they don't comment on capacity utilisation data. Renault said it uses a different benchmark that shows a higher number for its plants. BMW also said the data may underestimate its actual levels.

For Volkswagen, pressure by German unions and politicians to make its EVs at home - a move designed to future-proof jobs has become a "poisoned chalice", said Justin Cox, director of global autos production at GlobalData, a data analytics provider based in London.

automaker is now using its most expensive locations to make high cost EVs, which are not selling in the numbers expected, Cox said.

"Premium costs and mobility for all are not compatible. This applies in particular to our German plants, which currently build the majority of our electric vehicles," Volkswagen CFO Arno Antlitz said in response to questions from Reuters.

Germany had the highest wages for factory workers in the automotive industry by international comparison at €59 (\$66) per hour in 2022, according to German autos association VDA, in contrast to €21 in the Czech Republic and 16 euros in Hungary. In China, wages hover around just \$3 an hour, according to a Reuters

At the same time, new car sales in Europe are struggling. They fell 18% in August to their lowest in three years, dragged down by a 44% drop in overall EV sales which included a 69% slump for German EV sales.

"We are calling for Volkswagen to bring out more models that normal consumers can afford - a cheap electric car or cheap combustion engine that's sustainable," said Stephan Soldanski, a union representative in the German city of Osnabrueck, where one of VW's

most underused plants is located. That plant is running at about 30% of its capacity, Soldanski said. The three models it makes - the Porsche Boxster, Porsche Cayman and the VW T-Roc Cabriolet - are all set to end by 2026 and unions have not heard what they will make next.

Under current labour agreements, if VW workers are idled, they continue to be paid. "We need ideas," Soldanski said. "We don't want a slow

death." Volkswagen's CFO has said it has one to two years to turn things around at its namesake brand in the face of Chinese competition, with a €10bn cost-cutting drive from last December no longer seen as enough to save the

company. Negotiations are due to begin with unions on September 25 over what further cost cuts are possil and VW has said plant closures in Germany cannot be ruled out.

It has already scrapped a decades-old job security agreement at six plants in Germany, enabling it to lay off workers from mid-2025, unless a new agreement is struck before

Labour representatives hold half the votes on the carmaker's supervisory board, however, making it hard for VW to force closures. Unions want a negotiated settlement but management says the scale of the challenges means something must give.

Managing overcapacity has long been a struggle for Europe's automakers, hamstrung by labour contracts and the risk of political blowback from shutting loss making plants.

Now, high interest rates and a weakening economy mean demand is dropping, just as more Chinese exports arrive. Volkswagen says annual European car demand should bump along at about 14mn vehicles, down from 16mn before the pandemic.

Some of the mass-market carmakers burdened with too much capacity in Europe have already taken steps to reduce costs.

French automaker Renault has cut thousands of jobs in the region as part of a €3bn cost-cutting

drive set in motion in 2021. Stellantis, formed through the merger of Fiat Chrysler and Peugeot maker PSA, will have cut almost 20,000 jobs in Europe since 2021 by the end of 2024.

Both cut production lines and reduced capacity so they are less dependent on large assembly plants, relying more on temporary workers with fewer permanent employees on payroll.

Ford, meanwhile, will axe 5,400 jobs in Europe and plans more cuts under a regional restructuring plan that includes stopping production at its Saarlouis plant in Germany, before ramping up output in Spain where costs are lower.

According to GlobalData, all three will have worse average capacity utilisation rates than VW at the end of 2024.

Auto industry experts say the east/west split in Europe is only likely to grow as Chinese entrants, including China's biggest EV maker BYD and its biggest exporter Chery, set up shop in countries such Hungary, Turkiye and Poland. "It will accelerate," said Andy

Palmer, chairman of Slovak battery maker Inobat and former Aston Martin CEO. "It's pretty inevitable." They say markets such as

Germany may be left making mainly premium or luxury cars with price tags that allow manufacturers to cover the higher operational costs. Stellantis has already shifted

some EV production to lowercost markets. It will make EVs in Poland via a joint venture with China's Leapmotor. Its Citroen e-C3, which should sell for about €23,000, will be made in Slovakia. But like VW, Stellantis has

severe excess capacity issues at home. Production slumped 63% in the first half of 2024 at its Mirafiori plant in Turin, the historic home of Fiat. Reuters was unable to determine capacity utilisation rates for the plant. Production of its main model,

the electric Fiat 500, has been on and off for months due to sluggish EV demand, while its Maserati luxury brand is limited to two low-volume cars. Workers at Mirafiori have been put on furlough schemes, partially funded by the Italian government.

Nevertheless, German unions argue that Volkswagen's wounds are self-inflicted. They blame management for not coming up with affordable, appealing EV models for them to make, which they argue would spur demand.

The German carmaker's cheapest EV is the ID.3 at over €36,000, while Stellantis brands have cheaper, if less powerful models such as the Fiat 500e, Citroen e-c3, and Opel Corsa.

"They have balanced out plants in countries with higher labour costs and lower labour costs for decades. Nothing has changed," said Georg Leutert, director of automotive industries at union federation IndustriALL.



Qatar, UAE: Strong historical relations

The official visit of Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi of the United Arab Emirates Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed al-Nahyan to Doha comes within the framework of the strong historical relations between Qatar and the UAE.

The visit comes to enhance cooperation and co-ordination between the two countries, and to raise them to new horizons. The visit reflects the depth and strength of bilateral relations, and the joint keenness of the two countries' leaderships to push them forward.

Qatari-Emirati relations are based on long years of deep history, the unity of language, religion, geographical proximity, social integration and cultural heritage. They are also based on common interests, mutual respect, co-operation and co-ordination to serve the interests of the two countries and their peoples as well as the Gulf region and the world.

The two countries are keen to exchange views on issues and developments in the region and the world, and exchange visits at the level of leaders and senior officials on a regular basis.

One of the most prominent recent visits was the one of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani paid to UAE in June, during which His Highness met with UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed al-Nahyan and discussed the fraternal relations between the two countries and ways to support and consolidate them in various fields, especially in regard to strengthening the bonds of fraternal cooperation for the good and interest of their peoples, in addition to strengthening joint Gulf action.

During the meeting that was held in Abu Dhabi, the two sides also discussed regional and international developments, and exchanged views on several issues of common interest, especially developments in the Gaza Strip and the occupied Palestinian territories. The two sides also confirmed the two countries' support for the efforts to cease fire in the Gaza Strip, and to reach a comprehensive and lasting peace based on the two-state solution, and to preserve the security and stability of the region.

His Highness the Amir paid a visit to UAE on Nov 9, 2023. On Jan 18, 2024, the Amir participated in a fraternal consultative meeting, alongside the leaders of Oman, Bahrain, Jordan and Egypt. The meeting was held at the invitation of the UAE president, under the title "Prosperity and Stability in the Region", at the St. Regis Saadiyat Island Resort, Abu Dhabi.

In December 2023, His Highness the Amir participated in the opening session of the 28th ses-



sion of the Conference of the Parties to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP28), held in Expo City Dubai.

In the context of continuous communication and permanent consultation between the two countries' leaderships, the UAE president came to Qatar on an official visit in December 2022. During the visit, the Amir held official talks session with him at the Amir Diwan. The UAE president congratulated the Amir for Qatar's hosting of the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022, and its exceptional success in organising and hosting this world championship.

During the talks, the two sides discussed the brotherly bilateral relations and ways to support and consolidate them in various fields, especially in regard to strengthening the bonds of co-operation for the good and interest of the two brotherly people, in addition to strengthening joint Gulf action. They also reviewed the developments of regional and international events and exchanged views on a number of current issues of common concern.

In October 2023, President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed al-Nahyan visited Doha to participate in the opening ceremony of the International Horticultural Expo 2023 Doha. His Highness the Amir patronised the opening ceremony of the expo, under the theme 'Green Desert, Better Environment.'

Deputy Ruler of Abu Dhabi and National Security Adviser of UAE Sheikh Tahnoun bin Zayed al-Nahyan visited Doha several times. In August, the Amir met at his Amiri Diwan office with Sheikh Tahnoun, during which they discussed the existing fraternal relations between the two countries and ways to develop and strengthen them, in addition to discussing a number of topics of common interest.

In March, His Highness the Amir met at his office at Lusail Palace with UAE Foreign Minister Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed al-Nahyan and his accompanying delegation, on the occasion of their visit to the country. During the meeting, the fraternal bilateral relations were discussed as well as ways to en-

hance them, in addition to discussing a number of regional and inter-

national issues of mutual concern. In January, UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed al-Nahyan met HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani at the Qasr Al Shati in Abu Dhabi. During the meeting, they discussed co-operation relations between the two countries and ways to enhance and develop them, in addition to the latest developments in the region.

Qatar participated in Expo 2020 in Dubai, held between Oct 1, 2021 and March 31, 2022, under the slogan "Connecting Minds, Creating the Future." Qatar's pavilion at Expo 2020 Dubai was organised under the slogan "Qatar: The Future Is Now." On the economic level and in terms of strengthening relations and ties between the two countries, QatarEnergy signed in July 2023 a long-term condensate supply agreement with the Dubaibased ENOC Group. The agreement was signed by QatarEnergy, for and on behalf of Qatar Petroleum for the Sale of Petroleum Products Company Ltd (QPSPP), and ENOC Supply and Trading LLC, a subsidiary of ENOC. The 10-year sale agreement stipulates the supply of up to 120mn barrels of condensates to ENOC Group

starting from July 2023. HE the Minister of State for Energy Affairs, the President and CEO of QatarEnergy Saad bin Sherida al-Kaabi said that signing this long-term condensate sale agreement further strengthening QatarEnergy's relationship with ENOC, which extends back to 2008, while Group CEO at ENOC Saif Humaid al-Falasi said the long-term agreement with QatarEnergy will contribute to strengthening the co-operation and partnership between both organisations.

The terms of the agreement allows parties to further increase the condensate volumes under the contract, as additional condensate volume is expected to be exported from Qatar once the North Field East (NFE) and North Field South (NFS) expansion projects come online.

In the context of supporting economic relations between Qatar and the UAE, represented by their ministries of finance, the two countries signed in May an agreement aimed at avoiding double taxation and preventing fiscal evasion concerning income taxes. The agreement aims to conclude tax treaties that eliminate all forms of double taxation between the two countries. This agreement will also enable both countries to prevent tax evasion and ensure justice and equality in the treatment of individuals, in addition to enhancing trade co-operation and increasing investment opportunities between governments and individuals.


