Iran president vows response to 'strikes'

President Masoud Pezeshkian said yesterday that Iran did not seek war with Israel but was ready to deliver "an appropriate response" to strikes this week on Iranian military sites. "We do not seek war but we will defend the rights of our nation and country." Pezeshkian told a cabinet meeting, adding: 'We will give an response to the aggression of the Zionist regime.

Ruling coalition loses majority in Japan

Japan's ruling coalition lost its parliamentary majority in a drubbing at yesterday's national election, raising uncertainty over the make-up of the next government and the outlook for the world's fourth-largest economy. With all but 20 of the 465 seats accounted for. Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba's Liberal Democratic Party (LDP), which has ruled Japan for almost all of its post-war history, and junior coalition partner Komeito took 209 seats in the lower house of parliament. Trump, Harris woo voters

Donald Trump supporters lined up for his rally yesterday at a famous New York arena while Kamala Harris went neighbourhood to neighbourhood in Philadelphia, just over a week before America votes in an extraordinarily close White House race. Trump's gathering at the nearly 20,000seat Madison Square Garden drew a blitz of coverage in the Republican's home city - a Democratic stronghold. Both candidates are making closing pitches in one of America's most divisive and suspense-filled electoral fights. Page 11

Calls for probe into **Georgian elections**

The Georgian opposition yesterday called for protests and the European Union demanded an investigation into "irregularities" after a disputed legislative vote that showed a win for the ruling party accused of moving towards Russia's orbit. Pro-Western President Salome Zurabishvili accused Moscow of being behind the election fraud, calling it a "Russian special operation". Amid angry opposition claims over the result. Zurabishvili called for a rally on Monday, Jailed former president Mikheil Saakashvili also called for mass protests.

Egypt proposes initial two-day Gaza ceasefire

gyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi has proposed an initial two-day ceasefire

and limited hostage and prisoner exchange aimed at securing "a complete ceasefire".

The proposal includes exchanging four Israeli hostages held in Gaza for Palestinian prisoners in Israeli jails, and would be followed by more negotiations within 10 days, Sisi said at a news conference in Cairo.

He did not say whether the plan had been formally presented to either Israel or Hamas.

Egypt, alongside Qatar and the United States, has for months been mediating indirect talks with little success.

Israeli spy chief David Barnea was due in Qatar yesterday for talks aimed at restarting negotiations towards a hostage deal.

There was no immediate comment from Israel or Hamas but a Palestinian official close to the mediation effort told Reuters: "I vnect Hamas would listen to the new offers, but it remains determined that any agreement must end the war and get Israeli forces out of Gaza." Israel has said the war cannot

end until Hamas has been wiped out as a military force and governing entity in Gaza.

At least 42,924 Palestinians, a majority of them civilians, have been killed in the Israeli offensive on Gaza, according to figures from the Hamas-ruled territory's health ministry.

Hezbollah fires rockets at north Israel

Hezbollah said it fired rockets at northern Israel vesterday, a day after it declared several areas in the region a "legitimate target" due to the presence of Israeli troops. The Iran-backed Lebanese group, at war with Israel since last month, said it targeted a "military industries base north of Haifa... with a large rocket salvo". Since late September Hezbollah

has announced similar strikes against defence industry facilities and military bases near Haifa, a major northern Israeli city. The group also claimed rocket fire on Nahariya and drone strikes near Acre, both of which are north of Haifa. Hezbollah issued an evacuation warning for more than 20 areas

in northern Israel on Saturday.

Israeli strikes kill 45 across Gaza; civilians' plight unbearable: UN

sraeli military strikes killed at least 45 Palestinians across the Gaza Strip yesterday, most of them in the north of the enclave, Palestinian health officials said, as efforts to secure a ceasefire in the more than yearlong war resumed in Qatar.

The directors of the CIA and Israel's Mossad intelligence agency will meet with Oatar's prime minister in Doha, an official briefed on the talks told Reuters.

The death toll from Israel's campaign in Gaza is approaching 43,000, Gaza health officials say, with the densely populated enclave in ruins.

At least 43 of those killed yesterday were in northern Gaza, where Israeli troops have re-

turned to 'root out' Palestinian resistance (Hamas) fighters who it says have regrouped there.

Super League Kerala set to transform state's football culture





lhe launch of the Super League Kerala (SLK) and the formation of six professional football clubs, including the Kannur Warriors, marks a significant moment for football in Kerala. This initiative is set to revive Kerala's stadiums and reestablish the state as a formidable presence in Indian

The professional clubs aim to bring a fresh direction to Kerala's football culture, generating excitement for players, fans, and the sport itself. SLK, Kerala's first professional football league, goes beyond just hosting competitions—it's heralded as a turning point for the future of football in the state.

Football holds a special place in the hearts of Malayalees, being more than just a sport; it is an emotion. Kerala is unique in that it has passionate fan bases for all the world's top teams. The state is brimming with untapped football talent, and SLK's mission is to identify and nurture this talent from an early age.

The Kannur Warriors, one of the flagship clubs, is leading this effort. With a squad of 25 players, including six international players and a foreign coach, the club is committed to revolutionizing Kerala's football landscape. Promising young talents demonstrate skills will be offered professional contracts as early as age 11, along with expert training. These players will receive competitive compensations,

The champion team will be

awarded a grand prize of 10 million Indian rupees and a golden cup adorned with symbols of Kerala's cultural heritage. The runners-up will take home 5 million rupees and a silver cup.

The establishment of these professional clubs and investments they bring are sparking significant development in Kerala's football infrastructure. In a statement, the Kannur Warriors' management expressed confidence that the club would become one of India's leading football teams, having learned from the financial and operational challenges faced by previous clubs.

Shura Council attends **Arab Parliament** meetings in Cairo

Palestinian rights discussed

The Shura Council yesterday participated in the first plenary meeting of the first session of the fourth legislative term of the Arab Parliament at the headquarters of the General Secretariat of the Arab League in

The Council was represented in the meeting by Shaikha bint Yousef al-Jufairi, Issa bin Ahmed al-Nasr, Salem bin Rashid al-Muraikhi, and Hamad bin Abdullah al-Mulla, members of the Shura Council and members of the Arab Parliament.

The session discussed the overall developments and a number of Arab issues, in addition to the latest developments in the occupied Palestinian territories. It also reviewed the reports of the standing committees and a number of topics related to strengthening joint Arab action.

The session adopted a draft decision on the situation in Palestine and the occupied Arab territories, which included the Arab Parliament's affirmation of the right of the Palestinian people to establish their independent state with its capital in East Jerusalem, which is an integral part of the occupied Palestinian territories.

The resolution condemned the ongoing Israeli violations against the Palestinian people, including settlements, population displacement, land confiscation, and attacks on Islamic and Christian

The Arab Parliament's decision stressed the need to provide continuous Arab support to enhance the steadfastness of the Palestinians, especially in financial and political aspects, and to provide legal support to protect Palestinian rights in international organisations. It also called on the international community and the Security Council to take serious steps to stop Israeli violations and ensure the protection of the Palestinian people and their property, and to oblige Israel to implement relevant international legitimacy resolutions. The Shura Council delegation had earlier participated in the procedural session of the Arab Parliament, during which the president and vice presidents well as heads of the permanent committees of the Arab Parliament were elected.

Hamad bin Abdullah al-Mulla was elected (by acclamation) as Chair of the Foreign Affairs, Political and National Security Committee of the Arab Parliament. Mohammed bin Ahmed al-Yamahi





was elected as President of the Arab Parliament.

On the other hand, Shaikha al-Jufairi participated in the committee that supervised the elections of the Parliament president and his deputies. Furthermore the Shura Council delegation participated in meetings of the permanent committees of the Arab Parliament.

In this context, Shaikha bint Yousef al-Jufairi participated in the meeting of the Social, Educational, Cultural, Women and Youth Affairs Committee, while Issa bin Ahmed al-Nasr participated in the meeting of the Economic and Financial Affairs Committee, Salem bin Rashid al-Muraikhi participated in the meeting of the Legislative, Legal and Human Rights Affairs Committee, and Hamad bin Abdullah al-Mulla participated in the meeting of the Foreign Affairs, Political and National Security Committee of the Arab Parliament.

During their meetings, the permanent committees discussed an array of important topics

The Social, Educational, Cultural, Women and Youth Affairs Committee addressed the promotion of social and cultural values in Arab countries, and touched on education and upbringing issues, and the development of policies that support women's and youth rights, with a focus on empowering them socially and economically, and combating the challenges they face, such as unemployment and domestic violence.

The Economic and Financial Committee also raised the economic challenges facing Arab countries, such as inflation and unemployment rates, and the impact of global economic changes on member states, and discussed ways to enhance Arab economic cooperation and support joint investment initiatives to achieve sustainable development.

The Legislative, Legal and Human Rights Affairs Committee discussed human rights issues in the Arab world, and adopted a report on the most prominent proposed legislation to protect rights and freedoms, which included strengthening legal frameworks to combat cross-border crimes, protecting the rights of minorities and freedom of expression, and supporting reform legislation.

The Foreign, Political and National Security Affairs Committee also addressed the current nolitical situation in the Arab region, with a focus on security issues, including foreign interventions and regional political crises, and called for strengthening Arabinternational co-operation to enhance stability and Arab national security. 

QRCS project to assist families in northern Syria

In pursuit of food security and livelihood support for the most vulnerable families in northern Syria, Qatar Red Crescent Society (QRCS) has launched a new development project to help enhance livestock breeding and to ensure self-dependence for widows with no breadwinners, by providing dairy cows/sheep, training, fodder, and veterinary services for three months.

Implemented in Aleppo and Idlib countryside in co-operation with the Binaa Organisation for Development, the project involves providing 50 families with 50 dairy cows (one cow per family), as well as distributing 500 heads of sheep to 100 families (five heads of sheep per family). This livestock will represent a permanent source of



income for the beneficiaries, as they will be able to produce and sell milk and dairy products, thus meeting the needs of the local market, while securing their own

Also, the veterinary care services for cows and sheep will be secured

for three months, including vaccinations and treatment to ensure good health and better productivity for the livestock. The beneficiaries will receive technical support from veterinarians, who will make monthly visits to provide guidance and supervision. (QNA)

Call for leveraging Finnish experience in education

E Undersecretary of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MoEHE) Dr Ibrahim bin Saleh al-Nuaimi urged the male and female teachers participating in the second cohort of the "Khebarat" programme for Qatari teachers who are being sent to Finland to benefit from the Finnish experience in education and to study the reasons behind its excellence and leadership, emphasising the importance of adopting best practices in preparation for localising them in a manner suitable for local context.

They were also prepared for their trip by providing the necessary procedures, guidelines, and instructions they needed to know before and during their stay in Finland. Topics discussed included the school environment, its systems and procedures, the educational community, weather conditions, living and housing conditions, transportation, and Finnish society's cultural and social context.

Their questions and inquiries were also addressed, contributing to facilitating their experience while in Finland.

In his speech during the meeting, HE the undersecretary of the MoEHE thanked the teachers for joining the "Khebarat" programme and provided them with inspiring tips and guidance. He praised their commitment and eagerness to learn from leading global experiences, which will assist them in acquiring competencies and skills that can be applied in their work. He noted that they teach various subjects, including science, English, Arabic,



administration, mathematics, and information technology, across all educational stages. He also commended the partnership with the Ministry of Education in Finland for training Oatari teachers. He emphasised that the state has provided all the necessary inputs for the educational process, believing in the importance of investing in human capital, particularly in building national capacities in education. He explained that elevating the teaching

profession, attracting dis-

tinguished Qatari individuals, and empowering them at all professional levels represent a strategic goal for the MoEHE. In turn, Director of the Training and Development Office at the MoEHE Iman al-Mahannadi voiced her happiness regarding completing the procedures for the second cohort of teachers being sent to Finland to exchange and transfer international expertise.

The second cohort of the 'Khebarat' programme includes new specialisations based on the impressive re-

sults achieved by the first cohort. These new specialisations, including Arabic language, business administration, and information technology, aim to broaden the programme's impact across different educational fields. The programme content covers educational planning, assessment, classroom management, individual differences, and teaching and learning strategies, as well as the integration of technology in education within Finnish schools.



Mada virtual translator for Qatari sign language 'a pioneering step'

The "Bou Hamad" project, the virtual translator for Qatari sign language, has received positive feedback from beneficiary groups, confirming the importance of this technology in improving the quality of life for people with hearing disabilities.

Mada Centre media and publishing officer Khalifa al-Mutlaq told the Arabic daily Arrayah that "Bou Hamad" relies on artificial intelligence (AI) technology to translate written and visual texts into Qatari sign language, helping to facilitate access to information and digital services.

He expressed his pride that this virtual translator was made by Qatari hands.

Al-Mutlaq noted that the project aims to enhance digital inclusion and provide a supportive digital environment, and was developed by the Mada Centre with the active participation of

people with hearing disabilities. "Bu Hamad", an advanced solution that helps facilitate access to digital services for people with hearing disabilities, is not only useful on websites, but has also been employed at major events such as the Asian Cup, where it translated reports on events into sign language for followers with hearing disabilities.

"'Bu Hamad' has been well received by many, and we at the Mada Centre are constantly developing it based on the feedback we receive from people with hearing disabilities," al-Mutlaq said. "We have a specialised team that focuses on de-



veloping innovations and adapting them to suit the needs of this group."

"Our goal is to promote digital independence and inclusivity, and provide tools that facilitate people with disabilities' access to digital services and content effectively," he continued.

"We started working on 'Bu Hamad' in 2018," the official said. "Its development took a long time to reach the final product in 2021."

"During this period, we undertook many experiments and modifications based on the feedback of people with hearing disabilities," al-Mutlaq added. "Since its launch, 'Bu Hamad' has been integrated into several government and private platforms, such as the Asian Cup, where it was used to translate sporting events into sign language."

"We aspire to make it an essential tool on all digital platforms that serve people with hearing disabilities," he said.

The MoCl said it will co-ordinate with the dealers to follow up on





Doha conference to present new visions for the future of family

r Sharifa Noaman al-Emadi, Executive Director of the Doha International Family Institute (DIFI), a member of Oatar Foundation for Education, Science and Community Development, has stressed that the 30th anniversary of the International Year of the Family Conference, which will kick off on Wednesday under the title: "Family and Contemporary Megatrends", is a call to action, a platform for presenting new and sustainable visions for the future of the family in the contemporary world, and a forum for understanding and keeping pace with the transformations and challenges facing families.

In an interview with Qatar News Agency (QNA), Dr al-Emadi said the conference would provide an interactive platform for policymakers, academics, experts, and stakeholders to discuss and exchange ideas on the latest evidence-based studies in order to come up with a deep understanding of the impact of megatrends, such as technological, demographic, and climate changes, and international migration, on the structure of the family.

The conference will be held on October 30-31 at the Qatar National Convention Centre. Preceded by a youth summit tomorrow, it will bring together leaders from different countries of the world.

Dr al-Emadi termed the conference an opportunity for dialogue and discussion about the future of the family, and an invitation to the international community, organisations, stakeholders and decision-makers to support and empower the family at the global level and enhance international awareness of its crucial role in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, with a focus on issues related to mental health, education, and children's well-being, hoping for building strategic partnerships to develop innovative solutions that ensure the prosperity of current and future generations.

She explained that the conference will discuss demographic trends, such as declining fertility rates and ageing societies in sessions that will review the challenges and policies aimed at increasing fertility, and those that can improve the balance between work and family life.

She pointed out that innovative solutions will be proposed and presented by experts and participants with the aim of enhancing these policies. In addition, existing and required policies regarding the impact of digital technology on children's well-being will be addressed, while reviewing appropriate solutions on how to benefit from new digital technologies and programmes, social media and their impact on marital relations, as well as the impact of artificial intelligence on family privacy, and its role in empowering people with disabilities, with a special focus on upgrading education and learning tools for adults and children, including design and planning for elderly care.

The discussion in the climate change axis will centre on designing family-friendly cities and solutions that rely on natural resources in the surrounding environment to deal with contemporary challenges, such as forced migration resulting from climate change, food insecurity, and environmental anxiety.

She said the conference's outcomes are expected to contribute to drawing a clear roadmap for the next 10 years in relation to family support and protection policies at the local and international levels.

This map will focus on developing innovative policies that respond to the challenges of demographic and technological transformations, the impact of climate change, and international migration in order to ensure the stability and prosperity of families in the face of these transformations.

The conference, she added, will seek to provide comprehensive recommendations aimed at enhancing family empowerment programmes and developing legislation that ensures the protection of families from future challenges.

Regarding DIFI's role in developing the recently announced flexible and remote work system in the government sector, Dr al-Emadi said that the institute presented recommendations regarding the system

which later led the Civil Service and Government Development Bureau (CGB) to implement it.

The DIFI study "Work-Family Balance: Challenges, Experiences and Implications for Families in Qatar" showed that long working hours lead to fatigue and stress among Qataris especially working mothers and thus affect the needs of the family, she said.

She added that the study indicated that 49.4% of male employees and 38.4% of female employees expressed dissatisfaction with their working hours, and in response to this, CGB announced a flexible and remote work system that allows Qatari female employees with children under the age of 12 to work remotely for one month annually.

Other provisions included reducing working hours for reasons such as disability, medical excuses and maternity benefits.

DIFI's recommendations which were

presented to the Cabinet included granting maternity leave for at least three months with full pay and three optional months with half pay, granting fathers a one-week paternity leave, providing nurseries in workplaces, and creating special

rooms for mothers to store milk.

It was also suggested that fathers accompany sick children during treatment as well as limit working hours in the public sector to a maximum of 30 hours per

Dr al-Emadi explained that this new system provides flexible work options so that working mothers can select working hours that best suit their family schedule and bring a balance between work and family which in turn helps them manage their time better.

She expressed her hope that this system will be developed to include giving sufficient paid leave for mothers after childbirth, in addition to providing support programmes for new mothers.

she stressed the importance of supporting persons with disabilities (PWDs) by providing the necessary tools and technology that would better help them perform their tasks more effectively, in addition to creating a work environment to meet their needs, providing flexible work options according to their health conditions, allowing PWDs to work remotely to avoid any difficulties during transportation, and providing individual support programmes to help them deal with daily challenges.

The DIFI executive director highlighted that the institute participated in formulating many family-related policies. It launched several prominent initiatives including the "Tansheeh" programme which is structured to protect teenagers from behavioural problems. The programme was implemented in all schools by the Ministry of Education and High Education in 2023.

She noted that DIFI additionally called for mandatory pre-marriage programmes to help reduce divorce rates and that the institute is currently working on developing a curriculum for family relations for

secondary schools which is scheduled to be launched this year.

DIFI is also developing parenting programmes that were adopted by the Ministry to educate parents and provide them with the necessary skills and knowledge they need to upbring their children, Dr al-Emadi added.

Regarding DIFI's role on the regional and international scale, Dr al-Emadi stated that the institute plays an influential role in family policies through its co-operation with United Nations (UN) agencies and the issuance of important reports including its report on "Framework of Family-Sensitive Social Protection" which it completed in co-operation with the UN Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA).

DIFI also worked with the League of Arab States on a first-of-its-kind survey evaluating marital relations during the first five years of marriage in the Arab world. In 2018, the institute established a partnership with the UN International Children's Emergency Fund (Unicef) to increase the presence of parental education programmes across the Arab region, Dr al-Emadi underlined.

She expressed her hope to achieve a long-term impact on the family policy by establishing a set of strategic priorities and ambitious initiatives through increasing the number of studies, developing more effective advocacy strategies, establishing strong partnerships, and designing special policies and programmes to support PWDs, working mothers and families with low-income.

Executive Director of DIFI Dr al-Emadi concluded her statements to QNA by saying that work is currently being made to implement innovative awareness and educational initiatives and programmes, provide workshops and training courses aimed at professionals and decision-makers on best practices in supporting the family, in addition to establishing international research partnerships to exchange knowledge and expertise to improve family matters locally, regionally or globally. Poor sleep linked to brain ageing

People in early middle age who have poor sleep quality, including having difficulty falling or staying asleep, have more signs of poor brain health in late middle age, according to a study published last week in the online issue of Neurology, the medical journal of the American Academy of Neurology. The study, by a group of researchers from the University of California San Francisco (UCSF), does not prove that poor sleep accelerates brain ageing and only shows an association between poor sleep quality and signs of brain ageing.

"Sleep problems have been linked in previous research to poor thinking and memory skills later in life, putting people at higher risk for dementia," said study author Clémence Cavaillès, PhD. "Our study which used brain scans to determine participants' brain age, suggests that poor sleep is linked to nearly three years of additional brain ageing as early as

The study included 589 people with an average age of 40 at the start of the study. Participants completed sleep questionnaires both at the beginning of the study and again five years later. Participants had brain scans 15 years after the study began. Researchers reviewed participants' responses to questions such as, "Do you usually have trouble falling asleep?" "Do you usually wake up several times at night?" and "Do you usually wake up far too early?" They recorded the number of six poor sleep characteristics for each participant: short sleep duration, bad sleep quality, difficulty falling asleep, difficulty staying asleep, early morning awakening and daytime sleepiness.

"Making healthy lifestyle choices in middle age can impacts on brain health later in

Participants were divided into three groups. Those in the low group had no more than one poor sleep characteristic. People in the middle group had two to three, and those in the high group had more than three. At the start of the study, about 70% were in the low group, 22% were in the middle and 8% were in the high group.

Researchers examined participants' brain scans where the level of brain shrinkage corresponds to a specific age. Researchers used machine learning to determine the brain age for each participant.

After adjusting for factors such as age, sex, high blood pressure and diabetes, researchers found people in the middle group had an average brain age that was 1.6 years older than those in the low group, while those in the high group had an average brain age 2.6 years older. Of the sleep characteristics, bad sleep quality, difficulty falling asleep, difficulty staying asleep and early morning awakening were linked to greater brain age, especially when people consistently had these poor sleep characteristics over five years.

"Our findings highlight the importance of addressing sleep problems earlier in life to preserve brain health, including maintaining a consistent sleep schedule, exercising, avoiding caffeine and alcohol before going to bed and using relaxation techniques," said author Kristine Yaffe, MD, of the UCSF and a member of the American Academy of Neurology. "Future research should focus on finding new ways to improve sleep quality and investigating the long-term impact of sleep on brain health in younger people."

A limitation of the study was that participants reported their own sleep problems and it is possible they may not have reported them accurately. The study was funded by the National Institute on Ageing. Also last week in Neurology, Yale researchers reported that middle-aged people with uncontrolled blood pressure, blood sugar or cholesterol who don't exercise, eat healthfully or sleep well face a higher risk of stroke, dementia or depression later in life. "Our study found that making these healthy lifestyle choices in middle age can have meaningful impacts on brain health later in life," study author Dr Santiago Clocchiatti-Tuozzo said.



The era of Vietnamese nation's rise

King Charles to resume foreign tours

▼ing Charles III's cancer diagnosis will not prevent him flying abroad next year for foreign visits, a Buckingham Palace official said, as the monarch wrapped up a tour of Australia and Samoa.

"We're now working on a pretty normal looking full overseas tour programme for next year, which is a high for us to end on, to know that we can be thinking in those terms," the official said late on Saturday.

Charles was diagnosed with an undisclosed cancer earlier this year but doctors agreed that he could pause his treatment to allow him to travel to Australia and Samoa.

The palace announced in April that he would make a limited return to public duties, as doctors were "very encouraged" by his progress.

The official added that the king had "thrived" on the tour's programme which had much improved "his spirits, his mood and his recovery".

"In that sense, the tour, despite its demands, has been the perfect tonic," he added.

The tour was Charles's first to Australia, where he is also head of state, since he became king following the death of Queen Elizabeth II in September 2022.

Charles and Queen Camilla left Samoa on Saturday after the marathon 11-day tour that saw the king carry out more than 30 engagements.

The royal couple visited Sydney, Canberra and the Samoan capital Apia, where Charles attended a meeting of Commonwealth nations.

The 56-nation bloc - made up mostly of British ex-colonies had hoped to focus on a future threatened by climate change, but instead bickered over a troubled past marked by slavery and colonisation. - AFP

Trump holds rally at Madison Square Garden, Harris in Philadelphia

Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump will headline a rally of N Madison Square Garden yesterday, a highprofile event in a state that last backed a Republican president in 1984.

Opponent Vice-President Kamala Harris is traversing Philadelphia, the largest city and a Democratic stronghold in must-win Pennsylvania, and plans stops in a black barbershop and a Puerto Rican restaurant to encourage people to vote.

Speaking at the Church of Christian Compassion yesterday morning, Harris did not mention Trump by name.

"In this moment we do face a real question: what kind of country do we want to live in?" she

Trump's rally in Manhattan, like Harris's event in Houston on Friday with Beyonce, hopes to lean on star power to support local congressional candidates ahead of the November 5 election.

US billionaire Elon Musk, who is supporting Trump's re-election bid with his X social media platform, enormous wealth and cash giveaways that have raised legal questions, will be among the featured speakers, the Trump campaign an-

Trump, a New York celebrity for decades, will use the event at the iconic venue known for Knicks basketball games and Billy Joel concerts to deliver his closing argument against Harris.

"We want to close it out with a beautiful bang," he said last week.

Polls show the rival candidates are neck and neck in the battleground states that will decide the next president with just over a week until Election Day.

More than 38mn votes have already been cast. Trump has been seeking to tie Harris to the Biden administration's handling of immigration and the economy.

Last week, Trump debuted a new attack line: "She broke it, and I promise you I will fix it."

The US economy has outperformed the rest of the developed world since the coronavirus crisis, and stock markets hit record highs this year.

However, high prices of food, utilities and housing have roiled voters, who believe the economy is headed in the wrong direction.

Harris, who held a rally with Bruce Springsteen in Atlanta on Thursday, will hold another highprofile event with a speech tomorrow on the National Mall in Washington, where she will highlight contrasts between herself and Trump. "He is full of grievance. He is full of dark lan-

guage that is about retribution and revenge," Harris said of Trump in response to questions from reporters yesterday in Philadelphia.

Trump, who held a rally in Long Island, New York, in September, has said he is making a play for the state.

Ronald Reagan's re-election was the last time New York backed a Republican for president; Democrat Joe Biden won the state in 2020 by 23 percentage points.

Bulgaria holds another snap election

Japan's ruling coalition loses majority in parliament

parliamentary majority in a drubbing at yesterday's national election, raising uncertainty over the make-up of the next government and the outlook for the world's fourth-largest economy.

With all but 20 of the 465 seats accounted for, Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba's Liberal Democratic Party (LDP), which has ruled Japan for almost all of its post-war history, and junior coalition partner Komeito took 209 seats in the lower house of parliament, public broadcaster NHK reported.

That was down from the 279 seats they held previously and marked the coalition's worst election result since it briefly lost pow-

"This election has been very tough for us," a sombre-looking Ishiba told TV Tokyo.

Footage from the LDP headquarters showed gloomy faces as the projections based on exit polls said Ishiba's justice and agriculture ministers were likely to lose their seats.

Ishiba, a self-confessed security policy geek who likes making model planes, had said his target in the election was for the coalition to win a majority.

Komeito's Keiichi Ishii, who took over as that party's new leader last month, lost in his district.

The biggest winner of the night, the main opposition Constitutional Democratic Party of Japan (CDPJ), had 143 seats so far, up from 98 previously, as voters punished Ishiba's party over a funding scandal and inflation.

The outcome may force parties into fractious power-sharing deals to rule, potentially ushering in political instability as the country faces economic headwinds and a tense security situation in East

"This is not the end, but the beginning," CDPJ leader Yoshihiko Noda told a press conference, adding that his party would work with other opposition parties to aim for a change of government.

Ishiba said he would wait until the final results, likely due in the early hours today, before considering potential coalitions or other power-sharing deals.

The prime minister had called the snap poll immediately after being elected to head the party last month, hoping to win a public mandate for his premiership.

His predecessor, Fumio Kishida, quit after his support fell due to anger over a cost of living crunch and the scandal involving unrecorded donations to lawmakers.

The election also took place nine days before voters in the United States - Japan's closest ally - head to the polls in another unpredictable ballot.

The LDP has held an outright majority since it returned to power in 2012 after a brief spell of opposition rule.

It also lost power briefly in 1993, when a coalition of seven opposition parties formed a government that lasted less than a year. Smaller parties, such as the

Democratic Party for the People (DPP) or the Japan Innovation Party, could now prove key to forming a government. The DPP had 27 seats so far

and the Japan Innovation Party 35 seats, according to NHK. But both propose policies at odds with the LDP line. DPP chief Yuichiro Tamaki has

not ruled out some co-operation with the LDP-led coalition, but Innovation Party head Nobuyuki Baba has rejected the idea. Ishiba has pledged to revital-

ise depressed rural regions and to address the "quiet emergency" of Japan's falling population through family-friendly measures such as flexible working hours.

However, he has rowed back his position on issues including allowing married couples to take separate surnames. He also named only two women as ministers in his cabinet.

Ishiba has backed the creation of a regional military alliance along the lines of the North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (Nato) to counter China, although he has cautioned it would "not happen overnight".

India warns social media after airline bomb threats

ndia has warned social media platforms of "consequential action" after hundreds of hoax bomb threats to Indian airlines this month triggered travel chaos and terror it said threatened national security.

Some threats led to planes being diverted to Canada and Germany, and fighter jets scrambled to escort aircraft in the skies above Britain and Singapore.

The government called the spread of the threats "dangerously unrestrained".

It warned social media platforms of "consequential action as provided under any law" if they do not comply with the

"prompt removal of misinformation".

"The instances of malicious acts, in the form of hoax bomb threats to such airlines, lead to a potential threat to the public order and security of the state," it said in a statement on Saturday. "Such hoax bomb threats, while affecting a large number of citizens, also destabilises the economic security of the country."

At least 275 bomb threats were made since mid-October, all reported to have been false, according to the Press Trust of India (PTI) news agency.

Other Indian media suggest it could be as high as nearly 400.

"The exemption from liability for any third party information ... shall not apply if such intermediaries do not follow the due

diligence obligations," it added. Civil aviation authorities have had to check every flight that has been threatened, many by mes-

Iran kills four after deadly attack in southeast

sages posted on X. The government warning did not mention any social media company by name, but cited an advisory notice from the information technology ministry.

"The scale of (the) spread of such hoax bomb threats has been observed to be dangerously unrestrained due to the availability of the option of 'forwarding/resharing/re-posting/re-tweeting' on the social media platforms," the information ministry said.

It said companies must report any offences "likely to threaten the unity, integrity, sovereignty, security or economic security"

of the country, and co-operate swiftly with government agencies to aid investigations.

The government has said that it is discussing "legislative action" to overhaul aviation and aircraft security laws, and to make those who make such threats guilty of a serious, or "cognisable", crime with longer potential sentences.

India, the world's biggest democracy, regularly ranks among the top five countries globally for the number of requests made by a government to remove social media content.

Last year, an Indian court hit X with a \$61,000 fine after the platform unsuccessfully challenged orders to remove tweets and accounts critical of the Modi government.

Storm Trami lands in Vietnam after wreaking havoc in the Philippines

🗻 torm Trami hit central Vietnam yesterday, threatening to trigger heavy rains and dangerous floods after leaving a path of destruction in the Philippines.

The Southeast Asian country, with its extended coastline, is prone to storms and floods that often cause significant casualties and property damage.

Quang Nam is forecast to hit 60cm, according to the national weather forecast agency.

"The risks of floods are high at urban areas from Ha Tinh to Binh Dinh provinces," the agency said.

Rainfall in provinces from Quang Binh to

Heavy rains are also expected to hit the Central Highlands, the country's key coffee growing area, according to the agency.

After sweeping across the Philippines' main Luzon island, Trami left large areas submerged under floodwaters, making rescue and relief operations difficult as Manila braces for the impact of incoming storm Kong-rey.

The storm hit the Philippines on Thursday, causing floods and landslides.

The Philippines' disaster agency an-

nounced last night that at least 110 people vere reported dead, though no provincial breakdown was provided for the death toll. Trami is the deadliest storm to hit the

Southeast Asian country so far this year "especially with the reported number of casualties", Ariel Nepomuceno in the Office of Civil Defence - which oversees disaster management - told AFP.

Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos vowed yesterday that help was underway for the residents of Camarines Sur province, located in the hardest-hit region of

"By air, land, or sea, we'll keep the support coming. Together, we will rise again," Marcos said on his social media accounts.

Trami, with wind speeds of up to 88kph (54.7mph), made landfall in Hue and Danang. Maximum wind speeds have since weakened to 74kph (46mph).

Last month, typhoon Yagi and the floods it triggered killed more than 300 people and caused property damage of more than \$3.3bn in northern Vietnam.

A recent study showed that storms in the Asia-Pacific region are increasingly forming closer to coastlines, intensifying more rapidly and lasting longer over land due to climate change. - Reuters/AFP
